This project is part of the Council-approved 2022 Program to renew our aging infrastructure and ensure wastewater is delivered to treatment plants efficiently.

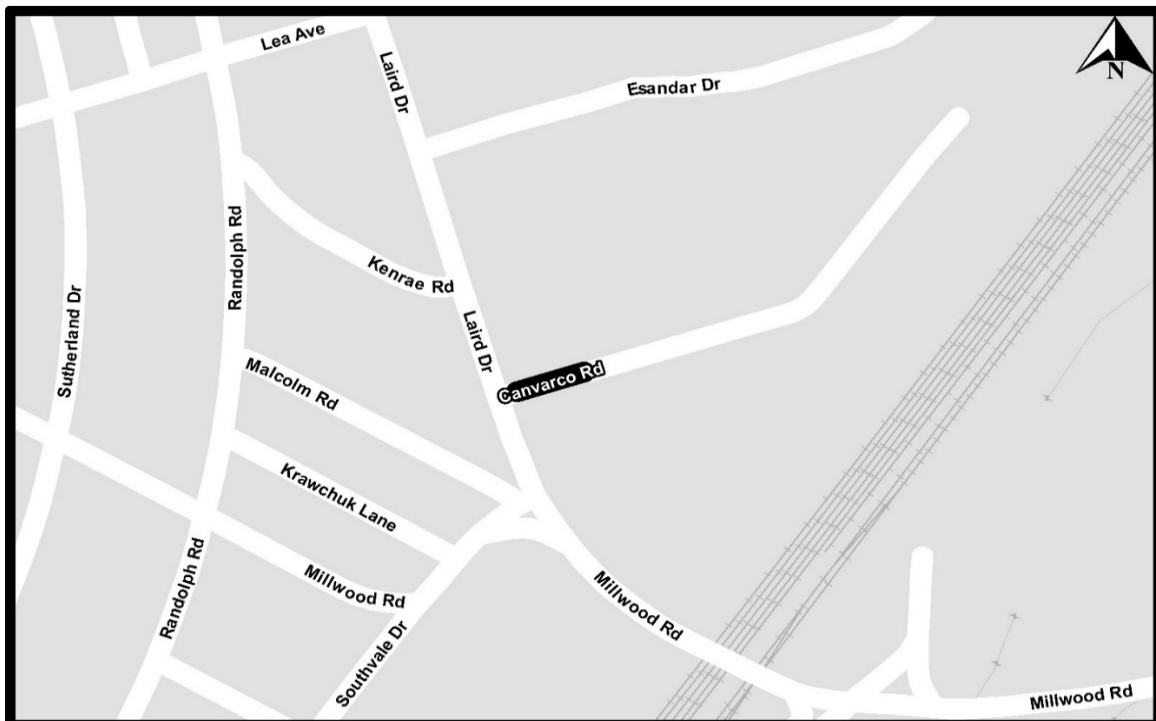
The City of Toronto is planning combined sewer replacement on Canvarco Road from Laird Drive to 45 meters east of Laird Drive. As part of the engineering design for the project, geotechnical investigation is needed on the sewers behind properties located at 41 to 53 Laird Drive. Portions of the parking lot will be closed temporarily in order to complete this work. The closure is expected to last up to 8 hours each day.

The sewer service is the underground pipe that brings wastewater to the sewer system and is owned by you and by the City. The part you own is from your house to the end of your property, the part the City owns is from the end of your property to the watermain.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

MAP OF WORK AREA









WORK DETAILS

For this project, the contractor will:

- Close portions of the walkway to complete geotechnical testing at boreholes.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise and traffic delays.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p> <p>Traffic on Canvarco Road will be reduced to one lane.</p>
	<p>Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.</p>
	<p>Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions, however any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.</p>
	<p>Cyclists: If travelling on Canvarco Road, please share the traffic lane in the active work zones.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p> <p>Extended work hours help to minimize traffic disruption, congestion and to shorten the project duration.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
