Watermain Replacement and Road Upgrades on Jarvis Street from Dundas Street East to Bloor Street East

Contract: 21ECS-TI-01SP

Start Date: Week of June 21, 2021 End Date: November 2022

As watermain replacement work continues on Jarvis Street, our contractor has completed initial work on the west side of Jarvis Street and is now preparing to start work on the East side of Jarvis Street. Construction work on the east side of Jarvis Street will impact traffic for vehicles travelling northbound and southbound on Mount Pleasant Road at Jarvis Street. Please see the listed dates for traffic /lane restrictions in the traffic management section of this notice. During this work our contractor will have Paid Duty Officers on site to monitor and direct traffic.

In addition to the lane closures from July 26th to August 4th, there will also be short term temporary road and lane closures on various adjacent streets as the construction moves along Jarvis Street until the end of August. These closures are dependent upon the daily progress of work and are difficult to schedule exact dates and times for these temporary closures. Please see listing of local streets below that temporary lane/road closures are anticipated for.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

JARVIS STREET LANE CLOSURES July 26th - August 4th

Monday July 26th – Friday July 30th – Motorists travelling southbound from Mount Pleasant Road will not be permitted to go northbound onto Jarvis Street to Bloor Street East. This will be closed. Motorists will only be permitted to go straight through to Charles Street or Southbound onto Jarvis Street

Monday July 27th – August 6th – Motorists travelling Northbound on Jarvis Street will not have access to go Northbound onto Mount Pleasant Road. Motorists will be permitted to travel straight through to Bloor Street East via Jarvis Street or westbound to Charles Street

Wednesday July 28th – August 4th – Motorists approaching Jarvis Street (going southbound on Mount Pleasant Road) will not be permitted to go southbound onto Jarvis Street or straight through to Charles Street as this area will be closed. Paid Duty Officers will be on site to direct drivers to the northbound turn for Bloor Street East.

INTERMITTENT TEMPORARY LANE/ROAD CLOSURES ON LOCAL ROADS July 26 – August 30th

During watermain installation our contractor will have to close some sections of roads in the Jarvis Street area for short periods of time (approximately 2-3 hours) during excavation and service connections. These temporary closures will last approximately 2- 3 hours due to specific work being completed adjacent to the Jarvis Street watermain.

Temporary closures will take place on the following streets: Charles Street, Isabella Street, Maitland Street, Gloucester Street, Earl's Place and Cawthra Square. During these temporary closures the contractor will have traffic control personnel on site to monitor and direct traffic during the closure. The contractor will allow access for residents during the closure when possible.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

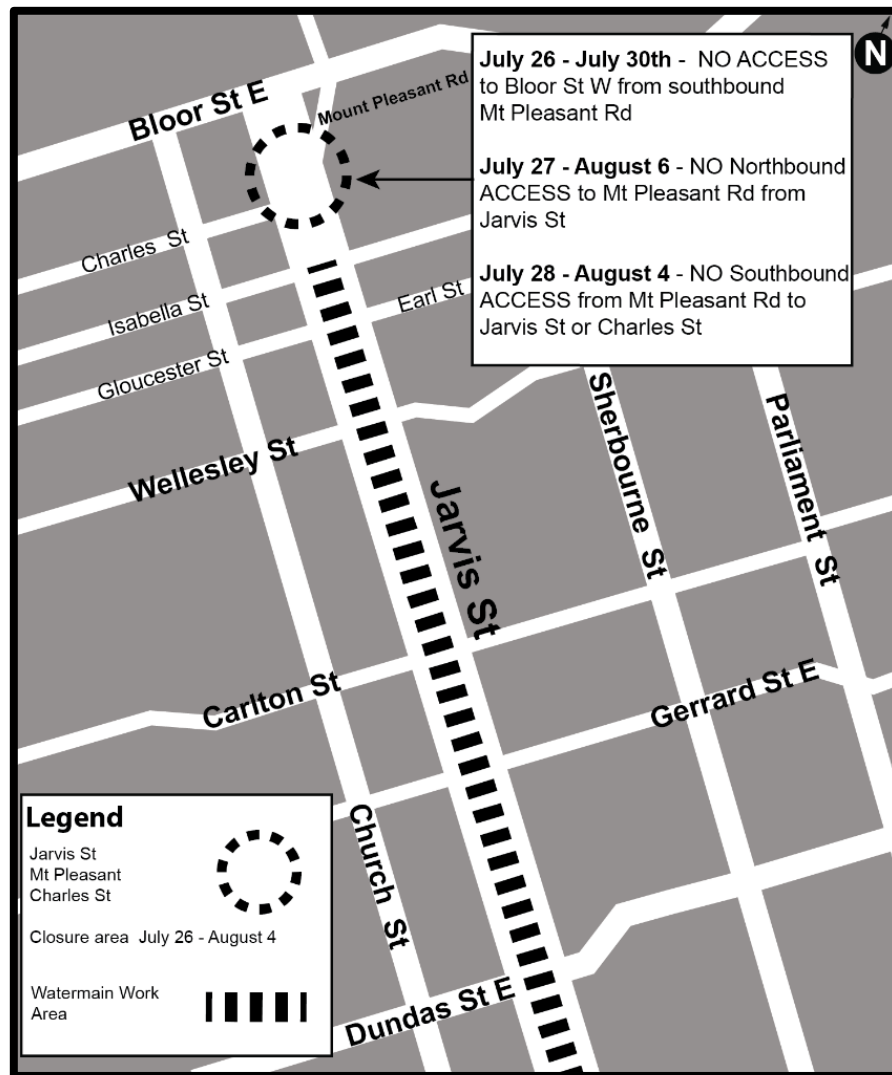
You will experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce local impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: During temporary lane/road closures on local roads the contractor will notify residents of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Public Consultation Unit staff listed below.</p>
