This notice provides an update on the watermain replacement work on Garratt Boulevard from Regent Road to Gilley Road.


Work on this project is progressing well. Since the remaining work includes road resurfacing and restoration that can only be completed during favourable weather conditions, this work has been postponed to next spring. All work on site will be suspended for the winter months and will resume in Spring 2022.


REMAINING WORK

The contractor will:

- remove and replace concrete sidewalks and curbs impacted by construction;
- restore boulevards and driveways impacted by construction; and
- resurface the road / watermain trench where impacted by the watermain replacement.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated

with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.

Parking Violation Notice: If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date:

- 1) Contact the site inspector or person listed on the Construction Notice and give them the yellow notice number.
- 2) Dispute the parking violation notice online or in person following the process listed on the back of the parking violation notice.

You may use this construction notice as part of the explanation of why the violation should be cancelled. Please note: violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones).

In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction and may need to temporarily park on your street.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
