





Project Overview

The New Davisville Community and Aquatic Centre (CAC)

The Davisville CAC will share facilities with the new Davisville Jr./Spectrum Alternative Sr. Public School next door, through a partnership with the Toronto District School Board (TDSB).

The school will have access to the aquatic facility's swimming pools and the City will have access to the school's double gymnasium and underground parking garage to support City recreation programming.




Features

- The new three-storey Davisville CAC will be accessible, and target net-zero energy building design, and is planned to include:
 - A 6-lane, 25-metre lane pool
 - A leisure/tot pool
 - Three floors of community, multi-use space
 - A small lobby
 - WIFI access throughout
 - Gender-neutral washrooms and change rooms
 - An active roof with community access and green space
 - Storage and staff office space


Mid Town in Focus Study

Existing Context



Access

- Connected to the school through an underground parking lot
- North-South Pedestrian Walkway will be open to public at all times
- School Playground is closed to public during school day
- Access to shared gym will be scheduled outside of school use



Construction

- School construction now complete
- CAC Construction scheduled to begin Fall 2022
- Safety of the community is always a priority during construction.
 - A 12 foot high hoarding fence will be installed along the boundaries of the City Community & Aquatic Centre construction area.
 - The City will keep the community informed on all safety measures put in place closer to the time of construction.








Site Plan






Ground Floor

- WIFI access throughout




Pool Change Rooms

- 2 family change rooms
- Ability to be combined into one larger change room
- Gender neutral washrooms
- Universal change rooms
- Private change cubbies with floor to ceiling opaque walls
- Open showers
- Grooming counters
- Hair dryers
- Transparent glass along corridor and pool deck


















