
The City of Toronto is rehabilitating and upgrading the Rexdale Boulevard Bridge in order to ensure safety for the travelling public. To facilitate the rehabilitation activities on the bridge structure, Rexdale Boulevard will be closed overnight between Humberwood Avenue and Highway 27, effective from 10 p.m. on Sunday, January 16, 2022 to 6 a.m. on Monday, January 17, 2022, weather permitting.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2017 Bridge Rehabilitation Program to renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of structure or element failure.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO



Construction Update #5

÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Sidewalk access over Rexdale Boulevard Bridge will remain open at all time. Temporary signage will direct pedestrians to safely cross the bridge
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	Traffic on Rexdale Boulevard will be closed for a period of 8 hours as noted, and will be returned to two lanes in each direction.
	Traffic on Jockey Club Road will be closed for a period 8 hours as noted, and will be returned to one lane in each direction.
	Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with residents about what is happening nearby. This could be about pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.
	Site Safety: Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the site inspector. If the site inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
