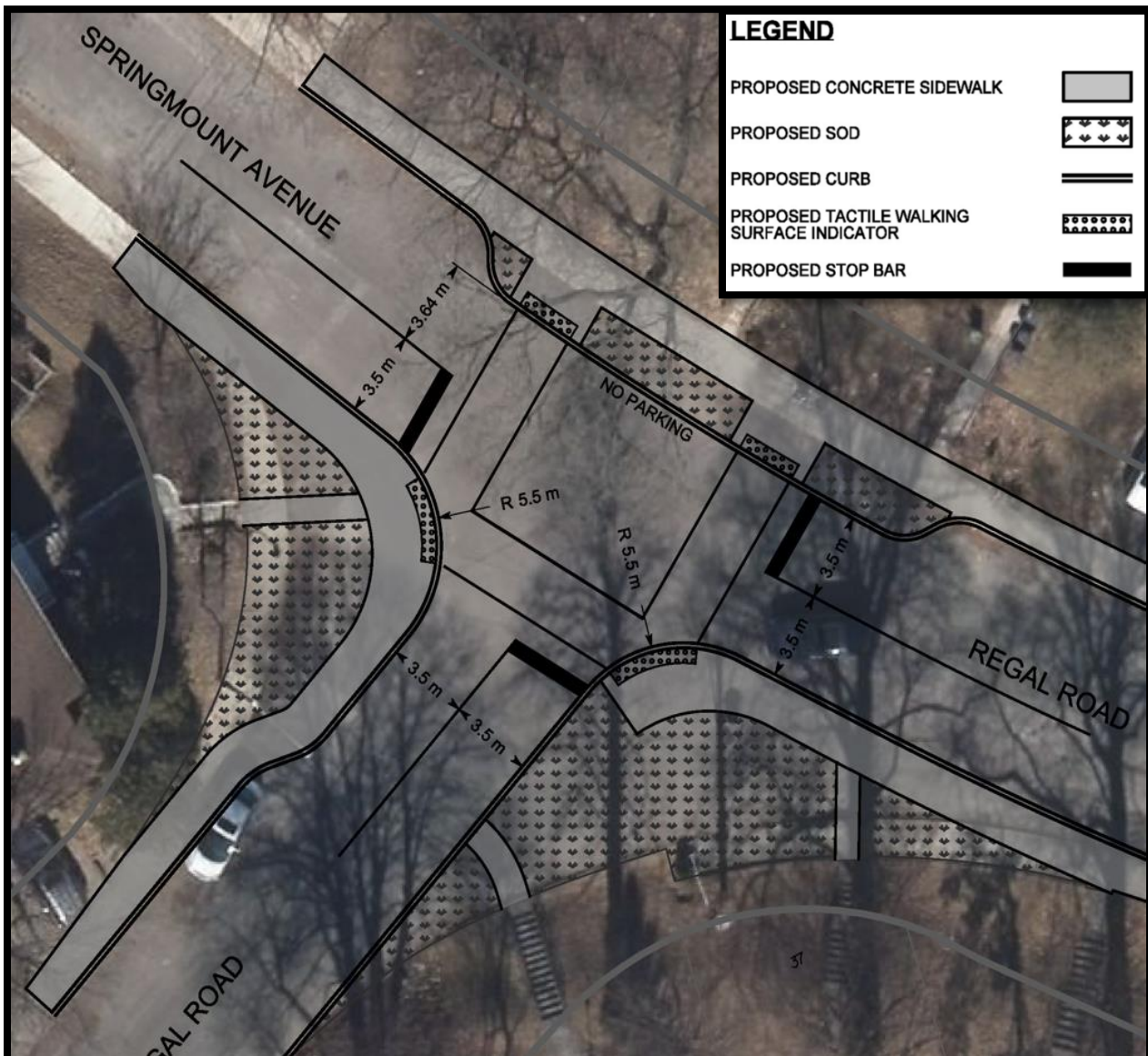
Regal Road & Springmount Avenue Intersection Modifications

Recent inspection by the City shows that sections of Regal Road need resurfacing to bring the road to a state of good repair. Resurfacing involves replacing the asphalt surface, and typically happens every 25-35 years. This planned road work provides an opportunity to bring the intersection of Regal Road and Springmount Avenue up to current standards and in line with industry best practices.

The City routinely modifies intersections as part of road work in order to meet current safety standards. Given the history of public interest and consultation on past changes at this intersection, the City is inviting the public to learn more about the proposed changes and provide feedback.

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Proposed Changes



Proposed Changes (cont.)

To improve the safety and accessibility of the intersection, the following changes are proposed:

- Reduced corner curb radii
- Bump-outs
- Sidewalk widening and accessibility improvements



The above modifications would improve the safety of the intersection by:

- Reducing the chance and severity of conflicts by slowing vehicle turns
- Increasing compliance with stop signs
- Increasing visibility between drivers and people waiting to cross
- Reducing pedestrian crossing distance and exposure
- Increasing the predictability of people walking, cycling, and driving through a smaller, more defined intersection

Next Steps

Following public consultation, the City will review feedback along with technical considerations before finalizing the design for the intersection.
