## Road Reconstruction on Wellesley Street East from Sherbourne Street to Ontario Street

**Contract: 21ECS-TI-04SP**

**Start Date: April, 2022 End Date: June, 2022**

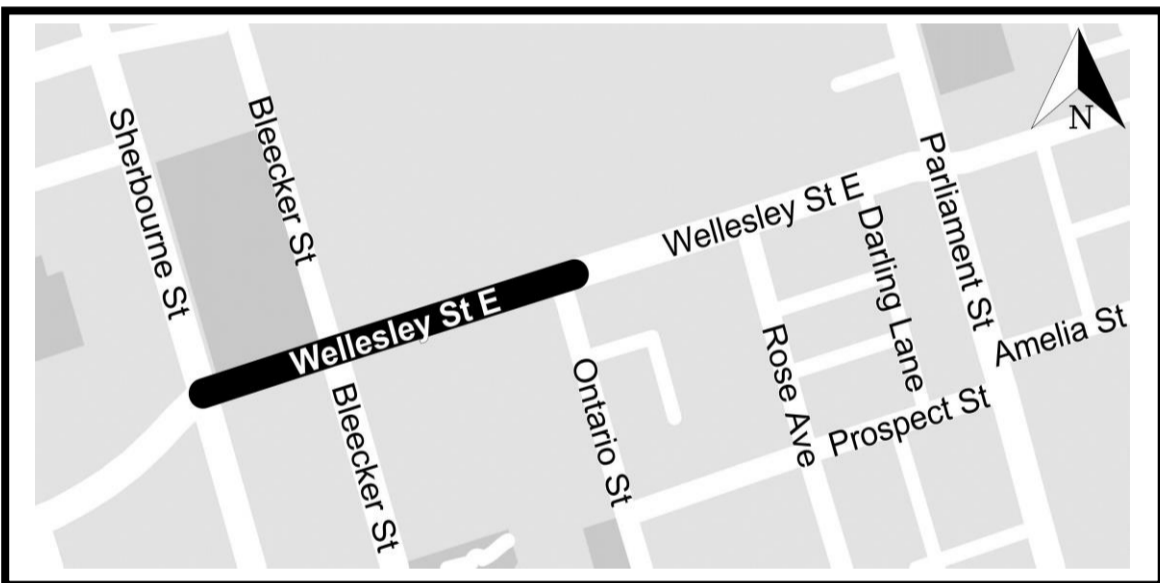

The City of Toronto is planning to reconstruct the road, curb and sidewalks on Wellesley Street East from Sherbourne Street to Ontario Street. Our inspection of the road shows that it requires replacement of the asphalt surface as well as the concrete road base. The curb and sidewalk also need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. The existing cycle track will be reinstalled with a concrete barrier after construction is complete.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2022 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalks for current and future needs.


During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. ### WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the <b>Public Consultation</b> staff listed below.</p>
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	<p><b>Access to Your Home:</b> The City-hired contractor may need access to the interior and exterior of your home to complete a pre-construction condition survey. Affected properties will receive a request to schedule a time to complete the pre-construction condition survey. Although participation is voluntary, the pre-construction survey results may be useful to confirm claims for potential damage caused by City construction.</p>
	<p><b>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features.</b> Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the <b>Public Consultation</b> staff listed below.</p>
