 - ✓ Double gymnasium
 - ✓ Aquatic component:
 - 25 m x 6 lane wide lap pool
 - Children's leisure pool
 - ✓ Multi-purpose spaces for various recreational programs & community access through the City's permit system
- Council Requirement Net Zero Emissions (Energy)
- Other Considerations:
 - Heritage preservation requirements, as determined by the City's Heritage Preservation Services
 - Compatibility with rail line safety setbacks
 - Working with Indigenous Communities and Treaty Holders to determine how to research and recognise historic and ongoing presence of Indigenous peoples on the land



Indigenous Consultation Goals:

 Ensure the new Wabash Community Recreation Centre is welcoming to Indigenous Peoples and uses, and reflects the historic and ongoing presence of Indigenous Peoples in the area

Feedback – Indigenous Advisory Circle Meeting 2

- Landscape design feature suggestions:
 - Include a natural water feature and fire pit outside the Centre for ceremony (e.g. to place tobacco offerings).
- Art suggestions:
 - Important to include throughout the site and should be used to tell stories.
 - Artists should be involved as early as possible.
 - The Mississaugas of the Credit have many artists who should be considered for this project.
 - Have Indigenous & settler artists work together to create a message around stewardship of the earth.
 - Consider representing Indigenous histories while tying in local community member histories as well.



Feedback – Indigenous Advisory Circle Meeting 2


- Comments on building features:
 - Kitchen: The kitchen will be useful for ceremony & teaching youth traditional cooking.
 - Multipurpose rooms: The different sized multipurpose rooms are useful for different activities.
 - Rooftop:
 - Put a BBQ on the roof to provide another space for cooking (important for ceremony).
 - Include a garden, potentially a medicine garden.
 - Include quiet, contemplative space.
 - Balance rooftop uses with the need to use rooftop space to host solar panels (LIAC members are supportive of a sustainable building).
- Overall:
 - Approval that the rooms will enable indoor smudging.
 - Happy with the Angler placement, as the placement doesn't impact any opportunities to make the building welcoming for Indigenous peoples or uses.
 - The Mississauga's historian will be providing a general site history this fall which will inform art and interpretative signage at the new centre.

The Angler site design has emerged as the preferred option through consultation with the local community, internal operations staff, and was confirmed as an appropriate option through the Indigenous Advisory Circle.













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Landscape Concept Sketch
















