Sanitary Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation in Jonathan Ashbridge Park, on Woodward Avenue, and Eastern Avenue

The City of Toronto is rehabilitating a section of the High-Level Interceptor (HLI) Sanitary Trunk Sewer (STS) which runs through Jonathan Ashbridge Park to the Ashbridge Bay Treatment Plant.

The HLI Sanitary Trunk Sewer is an underground pipe that collects wastewater from sewers and delivers it to the Ashbridge Bay Treatment Plant.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2021 Capital Works Program to renew the City's aging sewer infrastructure and will extend the service life of these trunk sewer sections approximately 50 years.

UPCOMING NIGHT WORK

In an effort to complete the construction on time, the contractor will be required to perform night work from March 30 to the end of April 2022, from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.

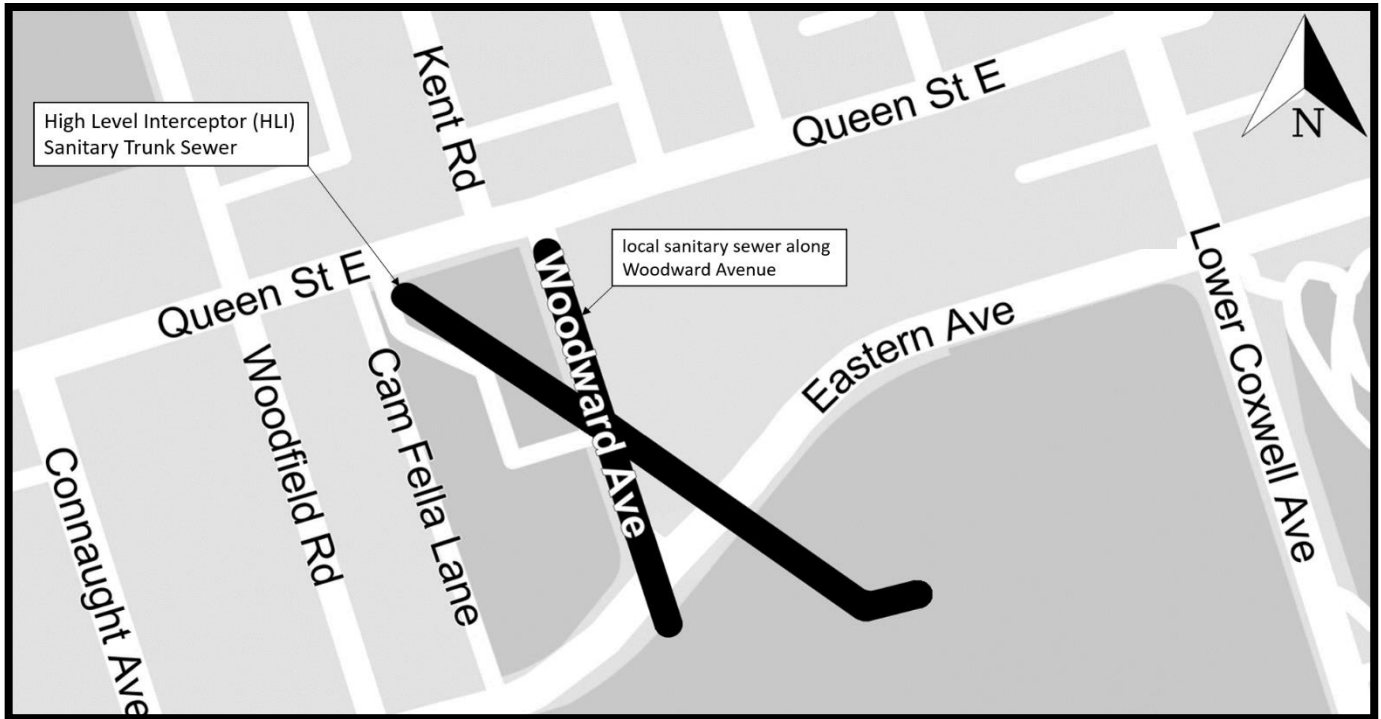
Most of the work will be performed underground but to assist the workers in the sewer, the Contractor will occasionally use equipment's such as a generator and an excavator.

IMPACTS

Potential light and noise may impact a few homes near the Jonathan Ashbridge Park.

The work area will be illuminated with floodlights. Floodlights will be required for the safety of workers and lights will be directed at the work area.

The work activities will generate noise at night. Some construction activities will generate more noise than others. The City will make efforts to reduce the noise. We appreciate your patience.
