This notice provides an update on road reconstruction on Kipling Avenue from Mount Olive Drive to Steeles Avenue West.

Following a winter pause, construction will resume on April 18, 2022. Work on this project is currently on schedule. The Work Details section below describes what has been completed to date and work that is remaining.

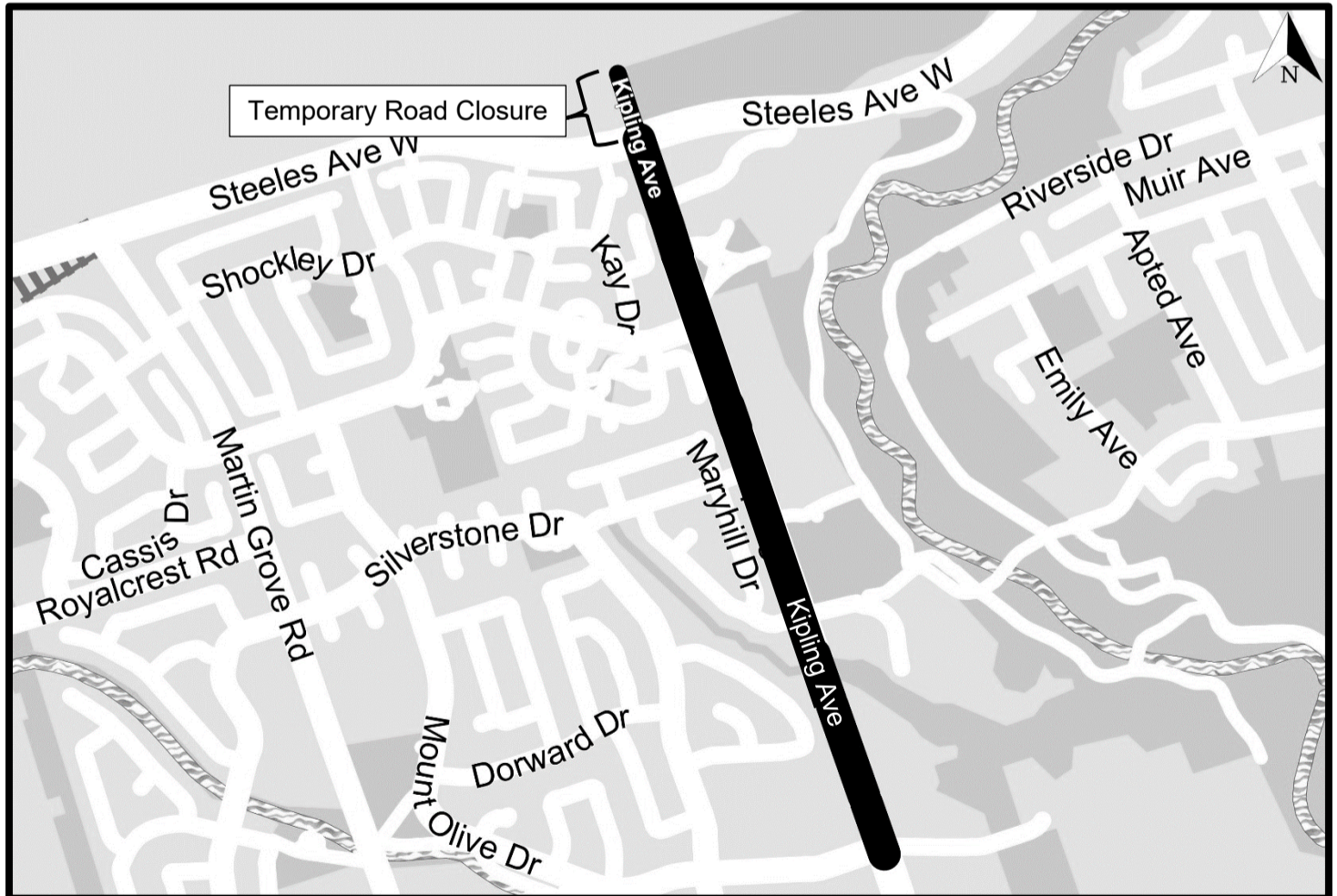
In order to complete the construction work north of Steeles Avenue West, Kipling Avenue will be closed from Steeles Avenue to 135 metres north of Steeles Avenue West (City Limit) from April 18 to May 16, 2022.

We know this project has an impact to all businesses and residents along Kipling Avenue. We sympathize and appreciate your patience with the dust, noise, fencing and other inconveniences while we improve important City infrastructure.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

WORK STATUS TO DATE

The City's contractor has:

- Completed sidewalk, concrete curb, road base and base asphalt from Steeles Avenue West to Mount Olive Drive.







- Completed road drainage work.





REMAINING WORK

- Road reconstruction from Steele Avenue West to 135 m north of Steeles Avenue West (City Limit).
- Final paving on road and multi-use-trail from Steele Avenue West to Mount Olive Drive.
- Traffic signal upgrades at all Kipling Avenue signalized intersections within project limits excluding Steele Avenue West intersection.
- Adjustment of maintenance holes and catch basins.
- Concrete bus pads.
- Boulevard grading and sodding.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday; and 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturday; with work after hours and on Sunday or Civic / Statutory Holidays as required.</p>
	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing and will follow relevant COVID protocols. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector and follow public health directions for reducing the spread of COVID-19 during in-person communication.</p>
	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
	<p>Telephone and Internet Services: This work may affect phone and internet cables for individual properties that aren't buried deep below the sidewalk. The contractor will coordinate with utility companies to minimize disruption. Residents who find their service has been disrupted should contact the Project Manager <u>and</u> notify their phone or internet service provider.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p>Traffic on Kipling Avenue from Steele Avenue West to Mount Olive Drive will be reduced to one lane in each direction through the work zones.</p> <p>Road closure on Kipling Avenue from Steele Avenue West to 135 metres north of Steeles Avenue West (City Limit) from April 18 to May 16, 2022.</p>

	<p>TTC Service: This project may affect travel times on the Kipling 45A and Kipling Express 945. Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
	<p>Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
