Royal York Road Bridge Rehabilitation over Mimico Creek

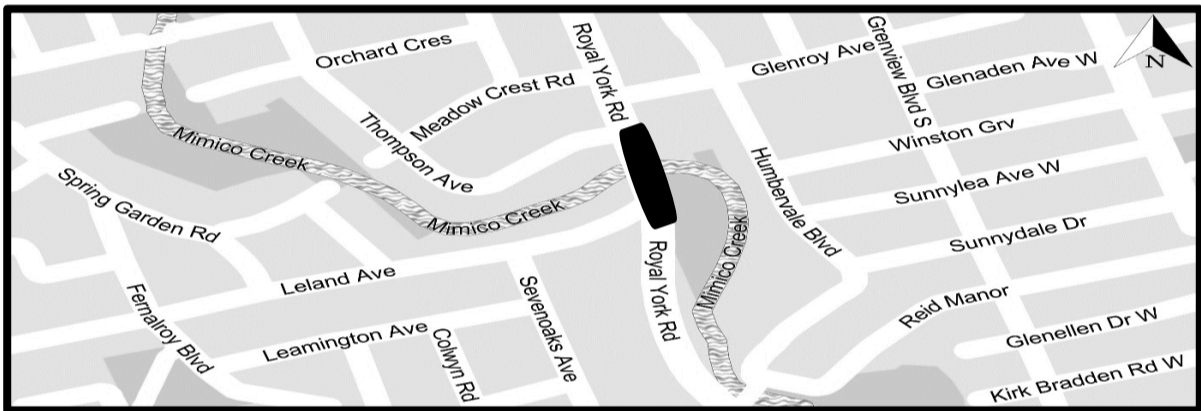

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Royal York Road Bridge over Mimico Creek. This work will ensure that this bridge meets today’s standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2022 Capital Works Program.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

WORK DETAILS





The City’s contractor will:

- Construct new approach slabs
- Patch repair the concrete deck and sidewalks, parapet walls, abutments and wingwalls
- Inject cracks in deck soffit and abutment walls
- Cleaning and coating of parapet wall railing
- Replace the asphalt surface and waterproofing

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Pedestrians will have access to both east and west sidewalks at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p>

	<p>Royal York Road Bridge over Mimico Creek will be reduced to one lane with a temporary traffic signal at each end allowing traffic in both directions for the duration of construction.</p> <p>The bridge will fully re-open to vehicles and pedestrians by August 31, 2022.</p> <p>Right turn (southbound) access to Royal York Road from Thompson Avenue will be restricted with "no right turn", and left turn (northbound) access to Royal York Road from Leland Avenue will be restricted with "no left turn" sign for the duration of construction.</p>
	<p>TTC Service: No impact on TTC bus routes except two bus stops north of the bridge will be temporarily relocated to north of Glenroy Avenue.</p> <p>Visit ttc.ca for information.</p>
	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing and will follow relevant COVID protocols. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector and follow public health directions for reducing the spread of COVID-19 during in-person communication.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
