## Shoreham Pedestrian Bridge Rehabilitation over Shoreham Drive

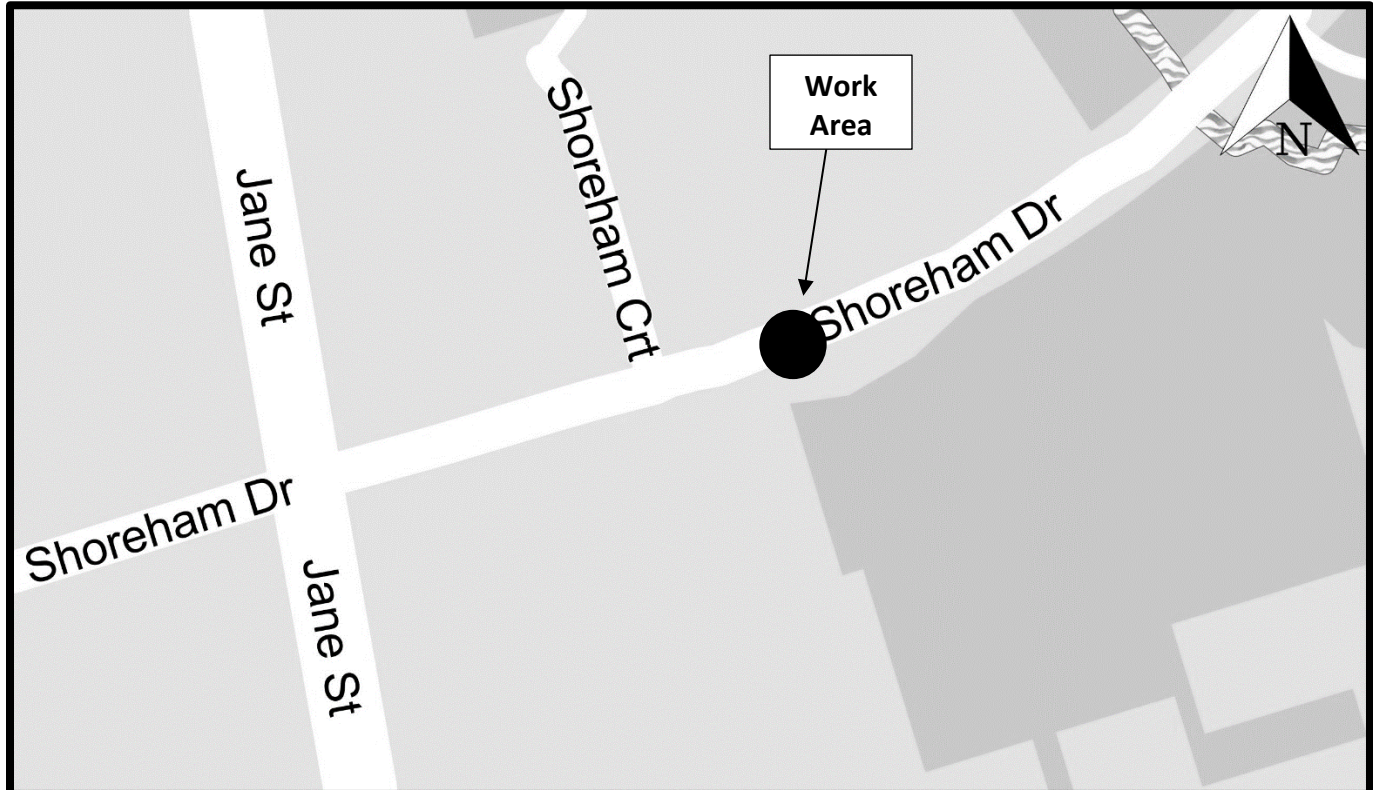

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Shoreham Drive Pedestrian Bridge over Shoreham Drive. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today’s standards and remains safe for pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2022 Capital Works Program.

### WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.

	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City’s contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect delays. Motorists on Shoreham Drive should expect shoulder closures and are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane.</p> <p>Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p>

	<p><b>Pedestrians:</b> The work will require <b>full closure</b> of the Pedestrian Bridge for the duration of construction as well as temporary sidewalk restrictions. However temporary Pedestrian crosswalks will be installed and maintained during construction</p>
	<p><b>Cyclists:</b> When travelling on Shoreham Drive, please share the traffic lane in the active work zone.</p>
