### Water Service Replacement and Road Restoration on Logan Avenue from Danforth Avenue to Bain Avenue

#### Contract: 20ECS-LU-19SU Start Date: April 19, 2022 End Date: May 2, 2022 \*Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will be replacing water services and completing minor road restoration work on Logan Avenue between Danforth Avenue and Bain Avenue. This work is the completion of the watermain and water service replacement work that was started in 2021.

Work will involve replacement of substandard water services for several properties located on Logan Avenue between Danforth Avenue and Bain Avenue. The water service is the underground pipe that brings water to your water meter and is owned by you and by the City.

The part you own is from your house to the end of your property, the part the City owns is from the end of your property to the watermain. <u>Impacted properties were previously notified about this work in</u> <u>December 2021</u>.

During water service work there will be times when water service will be disrupted. The contractor will provide notification to impacted residents prior to any water shut offs. The contractor will occupy sections of the curb lane on Logan Avenue while the work is being completed.

Traffic on Logan Avenue will be fully closed on block-by-block basis to facilitate active construction. Road closures will be removed at the end of each working day. On street parking will not be permitted in the active work zone during construction. Impacted residents will receive a temporary parking permit during this work.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. For more information on the City's response to COVID-19 please visit toronto.ca/covid-19.

#### **REMAINING WORK**

The City's contractor will:

- Complete all water service replacements to homes
- · Carry out restoration work associated with the water service replacements
- Complete road restorations, including asphalt paving and concrete sidewalks and curbs at select locations

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property.



**Work Hours**: Work will continue to take place from **7 a.m. to 7 p.m**., Monday to Saturday, with work after hours and on weekends as required. The contractor on this project may use extended work hours to minimize traffic disruption and to shorten the project duration.

8	<b>Traffic Management</b> : Efforts continue to be made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	<ul> <li>Traffic on Logan Avenue will be fully closed on a block-by-block basis to facilitate active construction.</li> <li>Road closures will be removed at the end of each working day.</li> </ul>
	<b>On-Site Communication:</b> There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, or site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing and will follow relevant COVID protocols. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector and follow public health directions for reducing the spread of COVID-19 during inperson communication.
÷	<ul> <li>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone.</li> <li>Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</li> <li>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</li> </ul>
	<b>Water Service Disruptions:</b> From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide notice at least 24-hours in advance. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not receive advance notice, the City may have needed to use an <i>emergency water shut off</i> to complete work.
<b>L</b> ing •	Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please take the time to read the attached fact sheet carefully as it contains important information on lead in drinking water and how to prepare for replacement. If you want to replace the private portion-of the water service pipe, the City of Toronto recommends that you obtain several quotes before selecting a contractor. PLEASE NOTE: The City is not able to get involved in any contract to have work done on private property. Property owners are responsible for ensuring contractors do not interfere with the work being done on City property. Learn more at www.toronto.ca/leadpipes
$\mathbf{R}$	<b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. This project will impact on-street parking. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call <b>416-808-2222</b> for its location.

	<ul> <li>Parking Violation Notice: Please ensure that you park in a legal parking spot at all times during construction. If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date:</li> <li>1) Dispute the parking violation notice online or in person following the process listed on the back of the parking violation notice. You may use this construction notice as part of the explanation of why the violation should be cancelled.</li> <li>2) Contact the site inspector or the person listed at the end of this Construction Notice and give them the yellow notice number.</li> <li>Please note: Parking violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction and may need to temporarily park on your street.</li> </ul>
Ŀ	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> listed below.
	Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
