## Resources and Services to Help Newcomers Settle In



As you settle in Toronto, there are a number of resources and services available through the City of Toronto to help make your transition easier. Many of the services are free or subsidized.

### **Housing Help**

#### **Emergency Shelter & Housing Supports**

There are housing services and supports to assist vulnerable people to find emergency shelter, as well as transitional and permanent housing that meets their needs. Services include:

- temporary shelter and support services for homeless individuals and families. For assistance, call 311 or Central Intake (24 hours a day) at 416-397-5637 or 1-877-338-3398 (toll-free within the GTA)
- housing help and supports for people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness to find and stabilize their housing situations. This includes housing searches, eviction prevention, information and referrals, assistance with making an application for subsidized housing, preemployment supports, and follow-up supports for homeless clients who are housed.
- guides to services that provide information tailored to specific user groups, including seniors, youth and vulnerable families. These are all available on-line

#### Applying for subsidized housing

Wait times for subsidized housing units can be very long, but those who qualify should make an application as soon as possible. The process is centralized and managed through Access to Housing.

#### **Health Services**



**Toronto Public Health** provides many free programs and services that do not require a health card. These include:

- vaccination services
- dental services for eligible children and youth, adults enrolled in selected Toronto Public Health programs, and seniors
- · confidential sexual health services
- Toronto Public Health eChat (The Toronto Public Health eChat is a free, confidential and anonymous online service for Toronto residents.) Chat online with a Public Health Nurse about our programs and services.

## **Employment and Financial Assistance**

**Employment and Social Services** is a City division that delivers the provincial Ontario Works financial assistance program.

Eligible recipients can receive support with finding employment and connecting to other available supports in the community.

- finding a job or getting the help necessary to look for work
- connecting to health, housing, childcare and other social services

If you need financial help, you may qualify for benefits through the Ontario Works program.

#### **Child Care**

**Toronto Children's Services** promotes access to high-quality early learning, child care and support for families. This includes:

- a child care finder that provides locations and quality ratings
- help with the cost of child care for families in financial need
- services for children with extra support needs
- EarlyON Child and Family programs that provide free inclusive programming for parents and caregivers with children 0 to 6 where families connect and learn together, drop-in, attend parenting workshops and receive information and access to resources.

#### **Seniors Services and Long-Term Care**

**Seniors Services Long-Term Care Homes & Services** is responsible for service planning and strategic integration of City services for seniors including:

- Community support programs such as adult day programs, supportive housing services, tenancy supports and homemakers and nurses services for vulnerable individuals who reside in the community.
- Directly operating 10 long-term care homes which provide 24-hour resident-focused care for permanent, convalescent, and short-stay admissions; care, services and programs enhance quality of life by responding to individual resident needs.
