Road Reconstruction on Beechgrove Drive between Minuk Acres and Copperfield Road

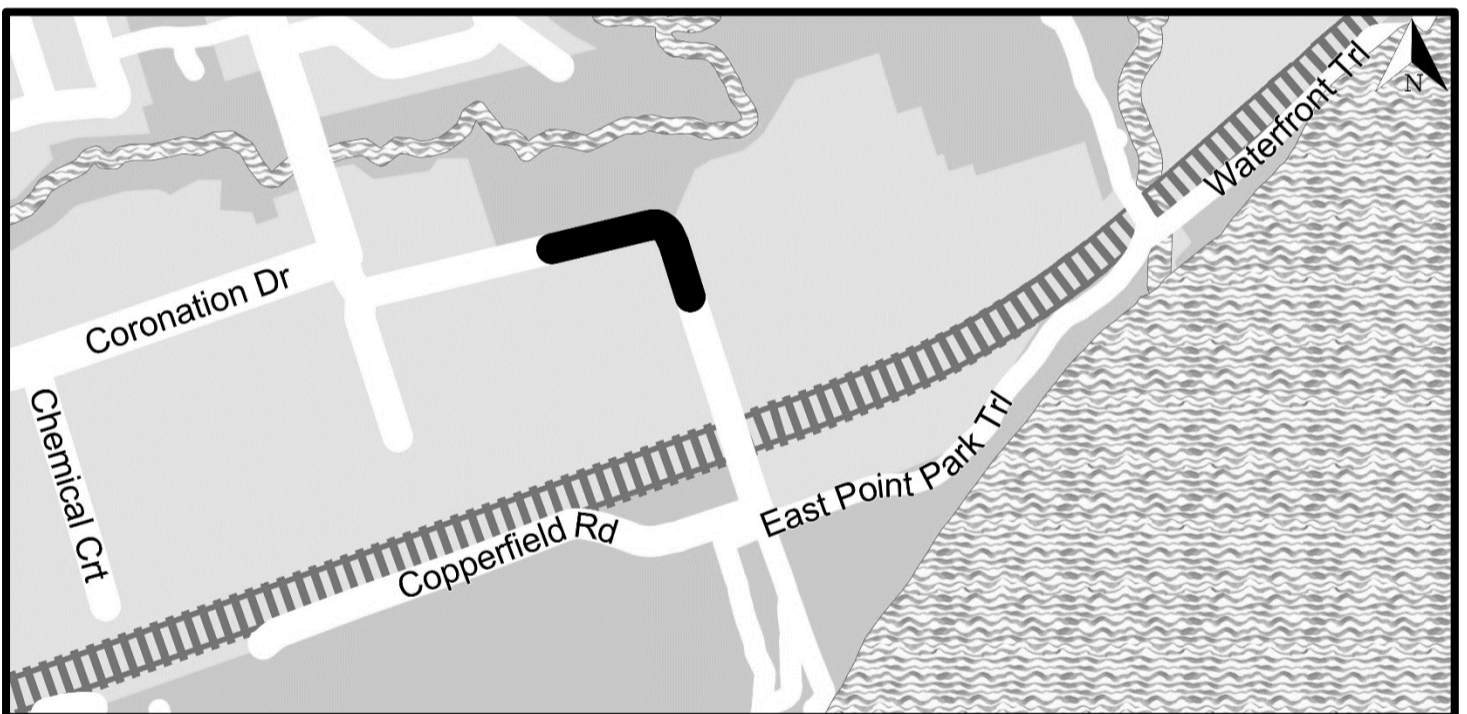
The City of Toronto is planning to reconstruct Beechgrove Drive from approximately 300 metres east of Minuk Acres to approximately 300 metres north of Copperfield Road. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs reconstruction, and the curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2022 Capital Budget and 2021-2029 Capital Plan for the Highland Creek Treatment Plant.

What to Expect Before Construction

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the **Project Manager** listed below.



Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.

Beechgrove Drive will be closed to vehicles and pedestrians from Minuk Acres to Copperfield Road for a two-week period starting around the end of May 2022.

Access to properties along this section of road will be maintained. The contractor is responsible for traffic management of the area.



Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.

This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the **Project Manager** listed below.
