#### The **City of Toronto** is responsible for:





# **Standing Committees**

#### Standing committees - make


recommendations on city-wide issues, such as parks, budget, roads and bridges, garbage and recycling, housing, planning, economic development, licensing and more. Final decisions are made at City Council meetings. There is an executive committee, chaired by the Mayor, as well as four standing committees.





## **Community Councils**

**Community councils** - make recommendations on local issues such as traffic lights, tree removal, parking permits, fence bylaws, appointments to local boards, local planning and development applications and more. They can make some final decisions without going to City Council. There are four community councils and each represents an area of the city.




### New business generally starts in committee

## **Staff Reports**



#### **Community Council Decision**

The Etobicoke York Community Council:

1. Directed staff to continue consultation with the Local Advisory Committee and to engage with the public and key stakeholders including equity-deserving groups within the local community, Indigenous partners, landowners, businesses and agencies, as necessary on the draft Official Plan Amendment, including the draft Secondary Plan, draft Zoning By-law Amendment and draft Urban Design Guidelines for the lands included in the Picture Mount Dennis Planning Framework Study, together with the Ward Councillor.

- Reports from City Officials make up the majority of agenda items
- Communications from Members of Council
- Transmittals from Agencies and Boards
- Transmittals from Advisory Committees
- Transmittals from Council or other standing or special committees



## How committee meetings work

Staff presentation (optional) Public presentations Committee members can ask questions of City staff Members speak to the agenda item and place motions Committee members vote on the motions and the item




# Council procedures provide opportunities for people to participate in the process

- Anyone can appear at committee on an item listed on its agenda
- No public presentations at Council
- Written submissions at any stage up to the point a final decision is made on a matter
