Yorkdale Transportation Master Plan

The City of Toronto is undertaking a Transportation Master Plan study (TMP) to ensure the required transportation infrastructure can support the existing and future needs of this area. As part of the TMP, the City has completed an evaluation of existing and long-term improvements needed to support transportation for all road users, including pedestrians, cyclists, transit users, and drivers of personal and commercial vehicles, in and around the Yorkdale Shopping Centre.

The preferred solutions, as identified in the map below, were rigorously tested through two levels of evaluation. These preferred solutions provide road capacity, transit, cycling and pedestrian improvements to support future area growth.

The preferred solutions include:

- New pedestrian and cycling facilities
- New dedicated cycling facilities
- Transit route improvements
- New mobility hubs, e.g. ride share and bike share stations
- New road infrastructure
- New sidewalks where there are existing gaps
- Intersection improvements

The City is also undertaking a comprehensive Yorkdale Block Master Plan study in partnership with Oxford Properties to create a long-term vision for the site. The Block Master Plan study is ongoing and a brief update will be provided at the virtual public event.



Virtual Public Event

A virtual public meeting is being held to present the evaluation results and the City's preferred transportation solutions. Public consultation will be conducted online, by phone and by mail only, in accordance with the City's guidelines for public meetings during COVID-19. At the virtual public meeting, staff will present the project and provide an opportunity to ask questions.

Environmental Assessment Process

The TMP is now in Phase 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process. The public is invited to provide feedback on the **preferred solutions** before a final report with the recommended solutions is completed and presented to City Council for consideration.

If approved by Council, the recommended solutions will be scheduled for future implementation or carried forward for further study, to satisfy additional phases of the Environmental Assessment process.



Next Steps

- Review public consultation feedback and refine the preferred solutions
- Develop high-level cost estimates and a phasing and implementation plan
- Report to Infrastructure and Environment Committee and City Council (anticipated in spring 2022) with final TMP recommendations
- Issue TMP final study report, Notice of Completion and 30-day public review period in early summer 2022
