

Highland Creek Village Transportation Master Plan

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Notice of Study Completion

The City of Toronto has completed a Transportation Master Plan (TMP) with the purpose of supporting the long-term revitalization of Highland Creek Village into a vibrant, pedestrian friendly and mixed-use community.

The TMP identifies infrastructure to support future growth and land development, as well as to accommodate all road users and the local community while minimizing environmental impacts.

The TMP study followed the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) process.

The following Schedule 'A+' projects are pre-approved and may proceed to detailed design and construction at any time. The individual improvements included in this project will be delivered through private development.

- Military Trail Traffic Signal
- Old Kingston Rd Streetscape
- Re-Alignment of Kingston and Morrish Rd
- New Laneway

The Highland Creek Overpass Removal is a Schedule 'C' project and requires additional investigation and consultation following the completion of the TMP to complete Phase 3 (Alternative Design Concepts for Preferred Solution) and Phase 4 (Environmental Study Report).

Opportunities for review

A TMP has been placed on public record for a 30-day review period starting **July 21, 2022** and ending **August 19, 2022**. It is available for review at toronto.ca/hcvtransportation or at the **Highland Creek Library** at 3550 Ellesmere Road. Interested persons may provide written comments to our project team by August 19th.

If you have any outstanding issues with the project, please address them to City staff listed below and we will attempt to find a mutually acceptable resolution.

A request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study, or that conditions be imposed, only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests must include your contact information and be received by **August 19, 2022**.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal and treaty rights, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request.
