R.L. Clark Water Treatment Plant Zebra Mussel Control – Piping Assembly & Installation

Contract: 20ECS-MI-01TW

Start Date: June 2022

End Date: October 2022

The City of Toronto has begun construction to upgrade the Zebra Mussel Control System at the R.L. Clark Water Treatment Plant. The majority of the construction work is within the R.L. Clark Water Treatment Plant and the Raw Water Intake Pipe in the Lake.

In the next few days, the Contractor will start assembling and preparing long sections of pipes which will be inserted into the plant's Raw Water Intake Pipe. To store the assembled pipe sections, the Contractor will be closing an area of the Water Treatment Plant as shown in Figure 1 below. East-west access across the plant's property, between Twenty Third Street and Colonel Samuel Smith Park Drive, will be maintained.

Signage will be posted on the fence to direct pedestrian traffic and all temporary fencing will be removed by the end of October 2022.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

WORK DETAILS

For this work, the contractor will:

- Install temporary fencing around the work area
- Install appropriate signage on temporary fencing
- Fuse and assemble piping section in the work area
- Insert the assembled piping into the plant's Raw Water Intake Pipe

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Truck Traffic: Occasional truck traffic, on Twenty Third Street, for delivery and removal of equipment from the water treatment plant during Work Hours.
	Site Safety: Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the site inspector. If the site inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.
	Disruptions: You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce these impacts. Local traffic will generally be unaffected. Your patience is appreciated.
	Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored with sod, concrete and asphalt where required to its initial condition. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons.
