This notice provides an update on rehabilitation of the Innes Avenue pedestrian bridge over the Metrolinx track.

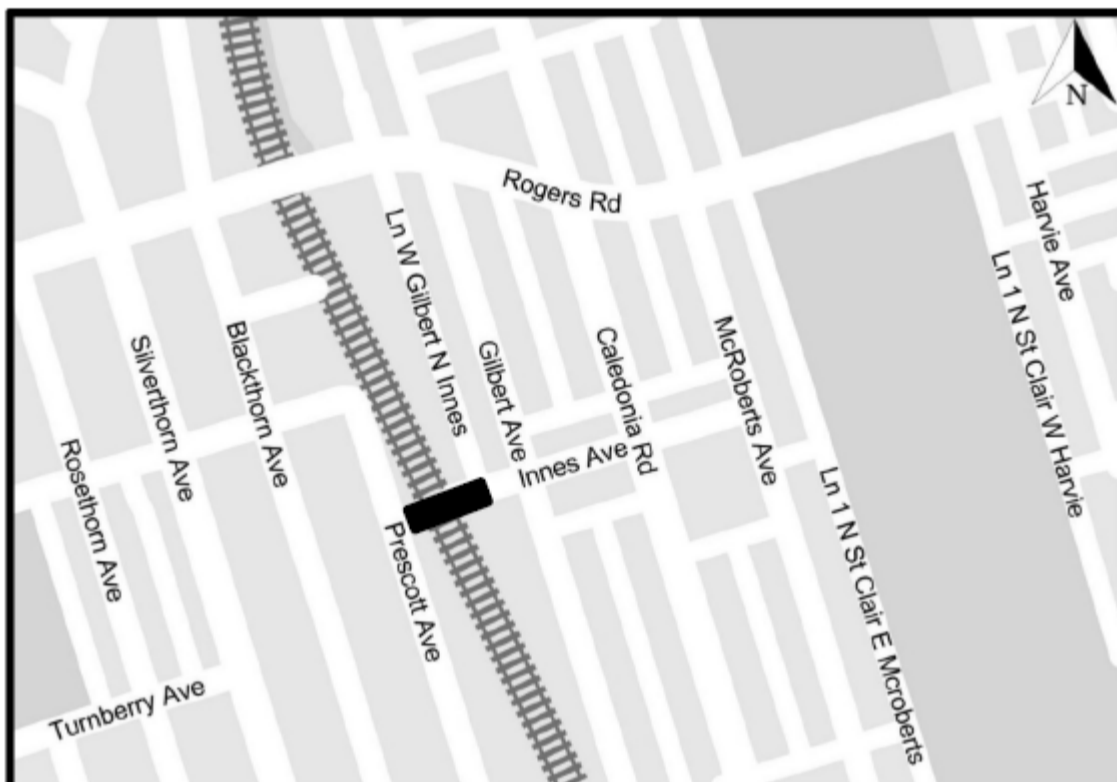

WORK STATUS TO DATE

The City's contractor has:

- Patch repaired concrete deck and soffit
- Repaired corroded structural steel sections at columns, beams and truss members
- Installed frames and enclosure mesh around the bridge ramps
- Installed new handrail

REMAINING WORK

The City's contractor will:

- Clean and re-coat structural steel
- Extend roof over top level of the ramps
