## Brimley Woods Park Pedestrian Bridge Rehabilitation

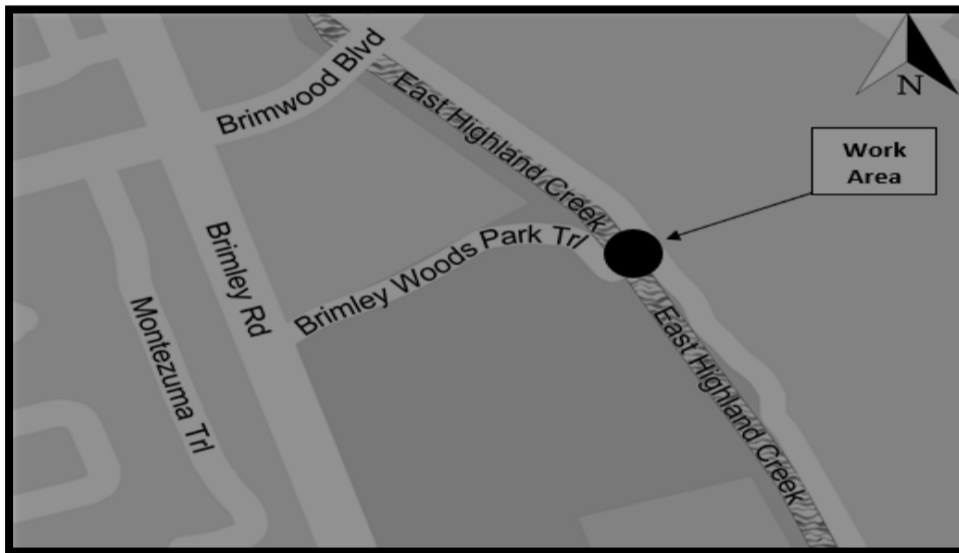
**Contract: 22ECS-BE-09BSE**

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Brimley Woods Pedestrian Bridge. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2022 Capital Works Program.

During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. The City's contractor will:

- Repair and refurbish the existing Brimley Woods Park Pedestrian Bridge
- Improve bridge, railings, approaches and drainage

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from <b>7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday</b>, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p><b>Trail Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, access to the trails will be restricted within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>East Highland Creek Trail will be closed during construction</b> from Brimwood Boulevard to the Pedestrian Bridge. In addition, <b>Brimley Woods Park Trail will be closed</b> during construction.</p>

	<p><b>On-Site Communication:</b> There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing and will follow relevant COVID protocols. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector and follow public health directions for reducing the spread of COVID-19 during in-person communication.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
