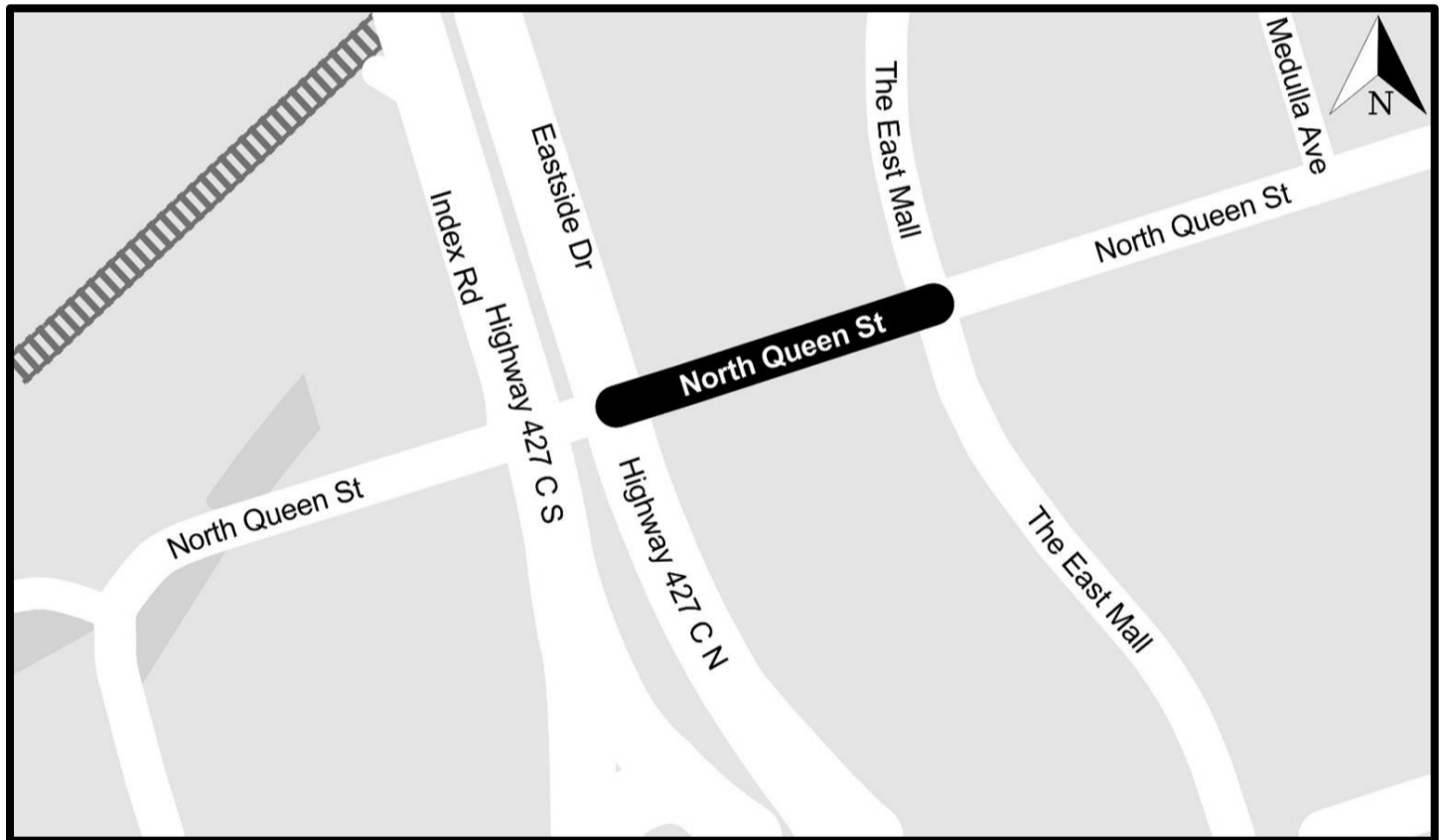
The City of Toronto is planning to install new sidewalks on North Queen Street from Eastside Drive to The East Mall. Sidewalks are a critical piece of transportation infrastructure which provide accessibility and safety for all, including vulnerable road users. Our data shows that sidewalk is missing on both sides of the road.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2022 Capital Works Program. Installing new sidewalk is one way the City is committed to making the community safer and more accessible.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible.
