West Humber Sanitary Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation

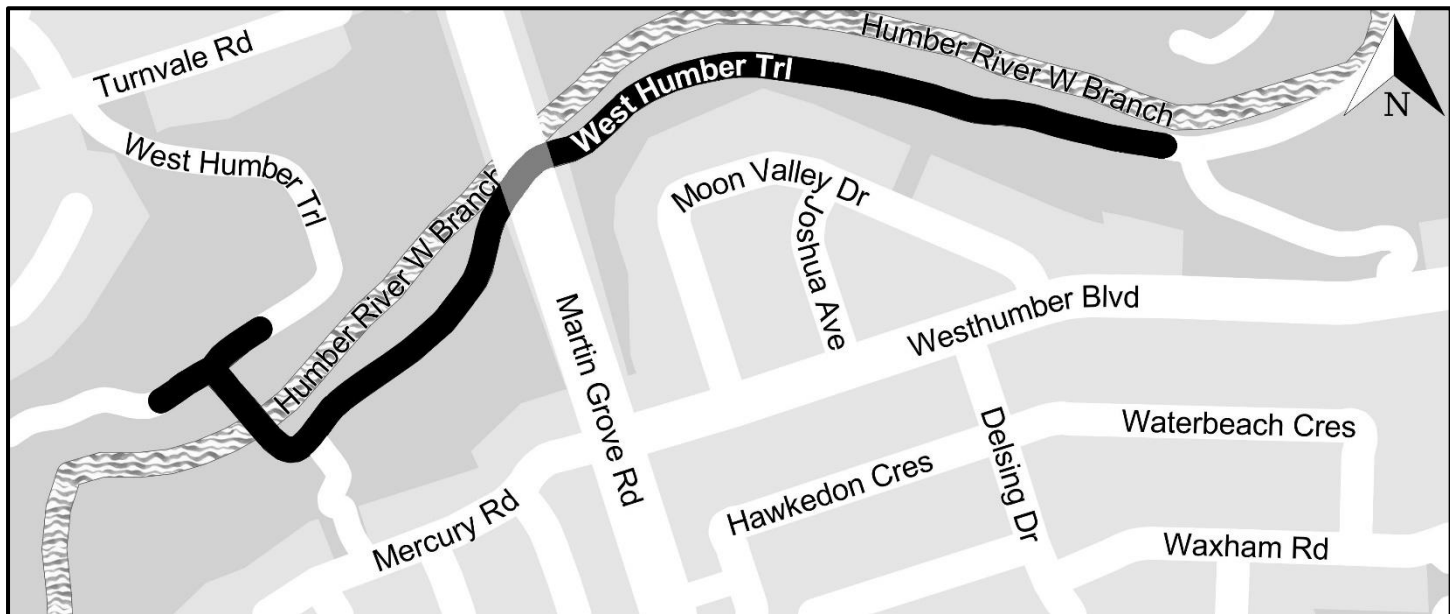
The City of Toronto plans to rehabilitate a section of the West Humber Sanitary Trunk Sewer (STS) from Humber Gate Park to Esther Lorrie Park. The sewer is located mainly along the West Humber Trail. The sanitary trunk sewer is an underground pipe that collects wastewater from sewers and delivers it to wastewater facilities for treatment.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2022 Capital Works Program to renew the City's aging sewer infrastructure and will extend the service life of the trunk sewer section by approximately 50 years.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

WORK DETAILS







The City's contractor will:

- Prepare the work area before construction begins including closing and fencing construction areas.
- Install temporary pumps and pipes to divert flow from the sewer so that it can be repaired from inside. The temporary pipes will be placed on the West Humber Trail
- Insert a resin-filled sock into the pipe through maintenance holes and cure it in place to form a new pipe.
- Rehabilitate all maintenance holes within the project area.
- Restore all impacted areas including the West Humber trail.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
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	<p>Sewer Service Disruptions: If the sanitary sewer service from your property requires a disruption to complete repairs the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. During sanitary sewer service disruptions, you will be advised to limit your water use.</p>
	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing and will follow relevant COVID protocols. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector and follow public health directions for reducing the spread of COVID-19 during in-person communication.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
	<p>Parks and Trails: Due to the nature of this work a section of the West Humber trail and Esther Lorie Park will be affected. Sections of the park, fields and trail will be fenced off and closed for public safety. Signs will be posted. All areas of the park and trail affected by construction will be restored.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
