

Martin Grove Road Watermain Replacement Crossing Mimico Creek

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study Notice of Study Completion

The City of Toronto has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study to replace / rehabilitate aged watermains crossing Mimico Creek as part of the watermain replacement program along Martin Grove between south of Savalon Court and Lorraine Gardens. The objective of the study is to provide a recommendation for the alignment of the replacement watermains.

The watermains on Martin Grove Road are 92 and 72 years old, have reached their end of service life cycle, have a history of breaks and need to be brought into a state of good repair.

Following consultation with the community and stakeholders, the alignment for the replacement will be located east of the Martin Grove Road bridge and outside of the Martin Grove right-of-way, but within Ravencrest Park.

Opportunities for review

The study was carried out following the requirements for Schedule B projects under the Municipal Class EA. A Project File report has been placed on public record for a 30-day review period starting Thursday September 8, 2022 and ending Friday October 7, 2022. It is available for review at toronto.ca/ martingrove or by calling the City staff listed on this notice.

Interested persons may provide written comments to our project team by **Friday October 7, 2022.** All comments and concerns should be addressed to City staff listed on this notice and we will attempt to find a mutually acceptable resolution.

A request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study, or that conditions be imposed, only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests must include your contact information and be received by Friday October 7, 2022.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for conditions or a request for an individual/ comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal and treaty rights, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request.
