

## 12.0 POTENTIAL FOR FUTURE AMMENDMENT

This study considered how, and where, to construct a trail to connect a critical gap in the Humber River Trail between Crawford-Jones Memorial Park and Mallaby Park in the City of Toronto. Through the MCEA process, it was determined that the preferred alternative will include an in-valley trail connection comprising a paved multi-use trail, with two pedestrian-cycle bridges and an elevated boardwalk along the west bank of the Humber River.

As per the requirements of the MCEA, this Project File is available for public review and comment for a period of 30 calendar days following the publication of the Notice of Completion. Concerns regarding the project should be directed to the contacts listed in the Notice of Completion. A request for a Section 16(6) Order (formally known as a Part II Order) may be made to the MECP for an order requiring a higher level of study, or that conditions be imposed, only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Additional contact information can be found in Chapter 2. Requests must be received by the Minister within 30 calendar days of the first publication of the Notice of Completion.

If the Minister does not receive a request for a Section 16(6) Order within the 30 calendar days, then the project will move forward to detailed design, approvals process and subsequent implementation of the preferred alternative.

In the event that a significant modification to the preferred alignment occurs after filing of the MCEA Final Report, a formal addendum shall be written.

The addendum shall describe the circumstances necessitating the change, the environmental implications of the change, and the associated mitigation measures required. The addendum will be filed with the Final Report and the Notice of Filing of Addendum will be given immediately to all affected parties. A period of 30 days following the Notice of Filing of Addendum will be provided for review and response.
