RUAC-DAY-FRI

WASTE COLLECTION

BLUE BIN, GARBAGE, GREEN BIN AND YARD WASTE ARE COLLECTED ON THE SAME DAY OF THE WEEK.



TYPE OF COLLECTION

The property owner selects **bin** or **bag** collection.

It is the responsibility of the property owner to provide residents with sufficient containers for garbage, recycling and organic waste or buy sufficient Garbage Tags*, if only using bags.

BIN COLLECTION	BAG COLLECTION
Garbage Bin , Blue Bin for recycling and a Green Bin for organic waste.	Regular size bags for garbage (purchase Garbage Tags* for each garbage bag). Use clear bags for recycling. Use a Green Bin for organic waste.

SETTING WASTE OUT FOR PICKUP

- Blue Bin (recycling), garbage, and Green Bin (organics) must be set out at the curb on your scheduled collection day (no later than 7 a.m.).
- Set-out times apply to both bin and bag collection.
- Access to the bins/bags must not be blocked by parked cars, ice/snow, oversized items or other containers on the day of collection.
- Please remove all tie-downs (i.e. bungee cords) prior to collection.



BLUE BIN RECYCLING

BLUE BIN

 All recycling, including newspapers, magazines and cardboard, must fit in a City-issued Blue Bin with the lid closed. Place items in loose.

BAG COLLECTION

- All recycling must be set out in clear/translucent bags.
 No bag tag is needed for recycling.
- Each bag cannot weigh more than 20 kg (44 lb).



GARBAGE COLLECTION

* Garbage Tags can be purchased at **toronto.ca/solidwastestore** or Toronto Canadian Tire and Shoppers Drug Mart stores. Tags never expire.

GARBAGE BIN

- All garbage must fit in a City-issued Garbage Bin with the lid closed.
- If you have excess garbage, you must put it in a regular black bag and affix a City of Toronto Garbage Tag*.

BAG COLLECTION

- Regular size garbage bag(s) (66 cm x 91 cm) affixed with a City of Toronto Garbage Tag* that is visible.
- Each bag cannot weigh more than 20 kg (44 lb).
- Broken glass and other sharp objects must be placed in a clearly marked sealed container. If the sealed container fits in the bag, please place it in the bag. Otherwise, place it beside the bag and affix a City of Toronto Garbage Tag*.
- Do not put liquids in your garbage.



YARD WASTE

- Use a paper yard waste bag or rigid open-topped container (learn size restrictions at toronto.ca/yardwaste).
- Place weeds, plant trimmings, crab apples, leaves, etc. in a paper bag.
- Each bag cannot weigh more than 20 kg (44 lbs).
- Yard waste in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected.

METAL AND OVERSIZED ITEMS

Metal and oversized items (e.g. appliances, furniture) can be left next to your Garbage Bin for pickup on garbage day.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Items such as batteries, cooking oil, medications, bleach, paint and fuel are considered household hazardous waste and will not be collected at the curb. For a complete list of household hazardous waste products and proper disposal options, visit **toronto.ca/hhw**.
