## TTC Track Replacement, Road Resurfacing and Watermain Replacement at the Intersection of King Street West and Shaw Street

**Contract: 22ECS-TI-11SP**

**Start Date: September 6, 2022 NEW End Date: December 16, 2022**

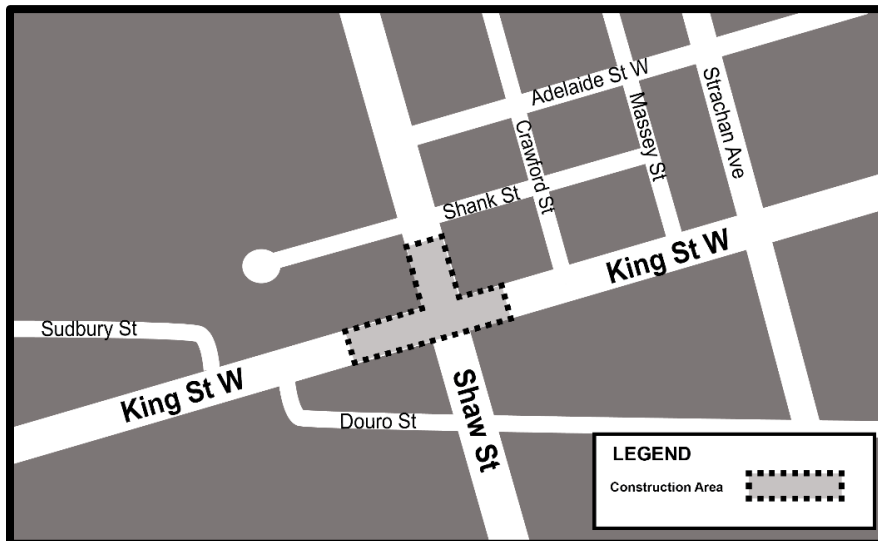

This notice provides an update on the infrastructure improvement projects being carried out by the City of Toronto and Toronto Transit Commission (TTC). Work at the intersection has been delayed due to issues connecting to the watermain. The construction work is expected to be complete and intersection re-opened December 16, 2022.

The City of Toronto and Toronto Transit Commission have been renewing aging streetcar tracks at the intersection of King Street West and Shaw Street and resurface the road. In addition to this work the City has replaced 80 meters of the watermain along King Street West.





This work is required to bring the track infrastructure to a state of good repair and is part of the Council-approved 2022 Capital Works Program.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect ongoing delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Signs will continue to be installed throughout the adjacent neighbourhoods advising of these closures.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• King Street West at Shaw Street intersection will be fully closed to vehicle traffic.</li> <li>• Douro Street to the south of King can be used as an alternative for east to west travel.</li> <li>• Strachan Avenue to east of Shaw Street can be used as an alternative for north south travel.</li> <li>• Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Sidewalk Access:</b> Pedestrians will have safe access to sidewalks within the construction areas. If contractor needs to temporarily close sidewalks alternate routes will be provided. Pedestrians are not permitted to cross the work areas (north - south). Signage will be installed advising where to safely cross.</p>
	<p><b>Shaw Street Bike Lane:</b> The bike lane will be temporarily closed through the active work area. Where possible, cyclists can merge into the available travel lane and ride single file with motorists, or dismount and use sidewalks.</p>
	<p>During this project, 504/304 King streetcars will be replaced with buses west of Bathurst Street, diverting around the closed intersection. 63 Ossington buses will also divert.</p> <p><b>Visit: <a href="http://ttc.ca">ttc.ca</a> for up to date service details.</b></p>
