



Complete Streets Installation on Danforth Avenue from Dawes Road to Victoria Park Avenue

Sunday June 12 - Friday July 15, 2022*

*Timeline is weather dependent and subject to change.

The City of Toronto will install complete streets features including cycle tracks (protected bicycle lanes) on Danforth Avenue from Dawes Road to Victoria Park Avenue as part of the Destination Danforth Complete Streets project. The first phase of Destination Danforth Complete Street was installed in the summer of 2020 from Broadview Avenue to Dawes Road. The project was evaluated between summer of 2020 and fall of 2021. In December 2021, City Council approved an extension of the complete street features to Victoria Park Avenue.

DESIGN DETAILS

The design is similar to Danforth Avenue between Broadview Avenue and Dawes Road and includes:

- Uni-directional cycle tracks installed on both sides of the street, providing safe cycling for all ages and abilities.
- One traffic lane in each direction maintained, with additional turn lanes at intersections,
- 24/7 on-street parking and loading maintained on Danforth Avenue, where feasible and;
- Curb extensions added to key locations.

WORK DETAILS

The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts of noise and other inconveniences. We appreciate your patience. During installation, the City's contractors will complete the following work:

- Remove and install applicable pavement line markings,
- Install concrete curb and flexible posts to separate the motor vehicle travel lanes from the new cycle tracks, and;
- · Install new signage, as required

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING INSTALLATION



Work Hours: Work will take place 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Noisy work will be limited to daytime hours as much as possible. Weekday work will take place mostly in the off-peak hours/evenings to limit disruptions



Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic.



- Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there
 may be partial road closures within the work zone. Sidewalks will remain accessible
 and pedestrians will be safely detoured around the work area.
- Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
- Side Street Access: Turns through the work zone may be narrowed and signed.
- Emergency Services: Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.



Installation Notice

	 Transit: TTC buses will continue to operate and access to subway stations will be maintained.
40	Cyclists: If travelling on Danforth Avenue, please share the traffic lane in the active work zones.
\mathcal{Z}	Parking and Loading: During installation phase, on-street parking on both sides of the street will be temporarily unavailable until new road markings and new signs are in place.
	Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects installation, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .
	 Parking Violation Notice: In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, the City encourages communities with construction to be patient as neighbours may need to temporarily relocate vehicles. If enforcement is called, enforcement must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket). If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date: 1. Dispute the parking violation notice online or in person, following the process listedon the reverse side of the parking violation notice. 2. Contact the City of Toronto using the phone or email below and give them the yellow notice number. You may use this notice as part of the explanation of why the violation should be cancelled. Note: that violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (e.g. in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones).
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
ف	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during installation. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, please inform the contact listed below.
	Important Information about Covid-19 and Construction in Toronto: During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. Ä,	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners and or business operators about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, or associated roadworks occurring in front of the home/business. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will follow relevant COVID protocols. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector and respect public health directions for reducing the spread of COVID-19.
