Purpose	To obtain authority to enter into a lease agreement with BESTWIND INDUSTRIES LTD. (the <b>"Tenant"</b> ) with respect to the property municipally known as 705 Progress Avenue, Unit 17, Toronto, Ontario, for the purpose of general offices and manufacturing of jewelry and electric plating (the <b>"Lease Agreement</b> ").		
Property	The property municipally known as 705 Progress Avenue, Unit 17, Toronto, as shown on the Location Map in Appendix <b>"A"</b> , comprising approximately 2,066 sq. ft. (the " <b>Premises</b> ").		
Actions	1. Authority be granted to enter into the Lease Agreement with the Tenant, substantially on the major terms and conditions set out in Appendix " <b>B</b> ", and including such other terms as deemed appropriate by the approving authority herein, and in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.		
Financial Impact	705 Progress Avenue is a jointly owned facility between the City of Toronto and Toronto District School Board (collectively, the "Landlord"). Net revenues collected are divided equally between the parties. The City's portion of total revenues is \$44,935.50 (plus HST), based on the total minimum rent from the lease agreement of \$89,871.00 (plus HST), for the period of thirty-six (36) months commencing January 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2025 of the Lease Agreement, as per below table. The City's net revenue portion will be transferred to the dedicated parkland reserve fund (5% and 2% Land Acquisition Reserve Fund Scarborough - XR2007) less the management fee to be included under cost centre FA1378 in the 2023 Operating Budget submission for Corporate Real Estate Management (CREM), as well as future operating budget submissions, for Council consideration.






