Expected Start Date: June 6, 2022 Expected End Date: December 1, 2022

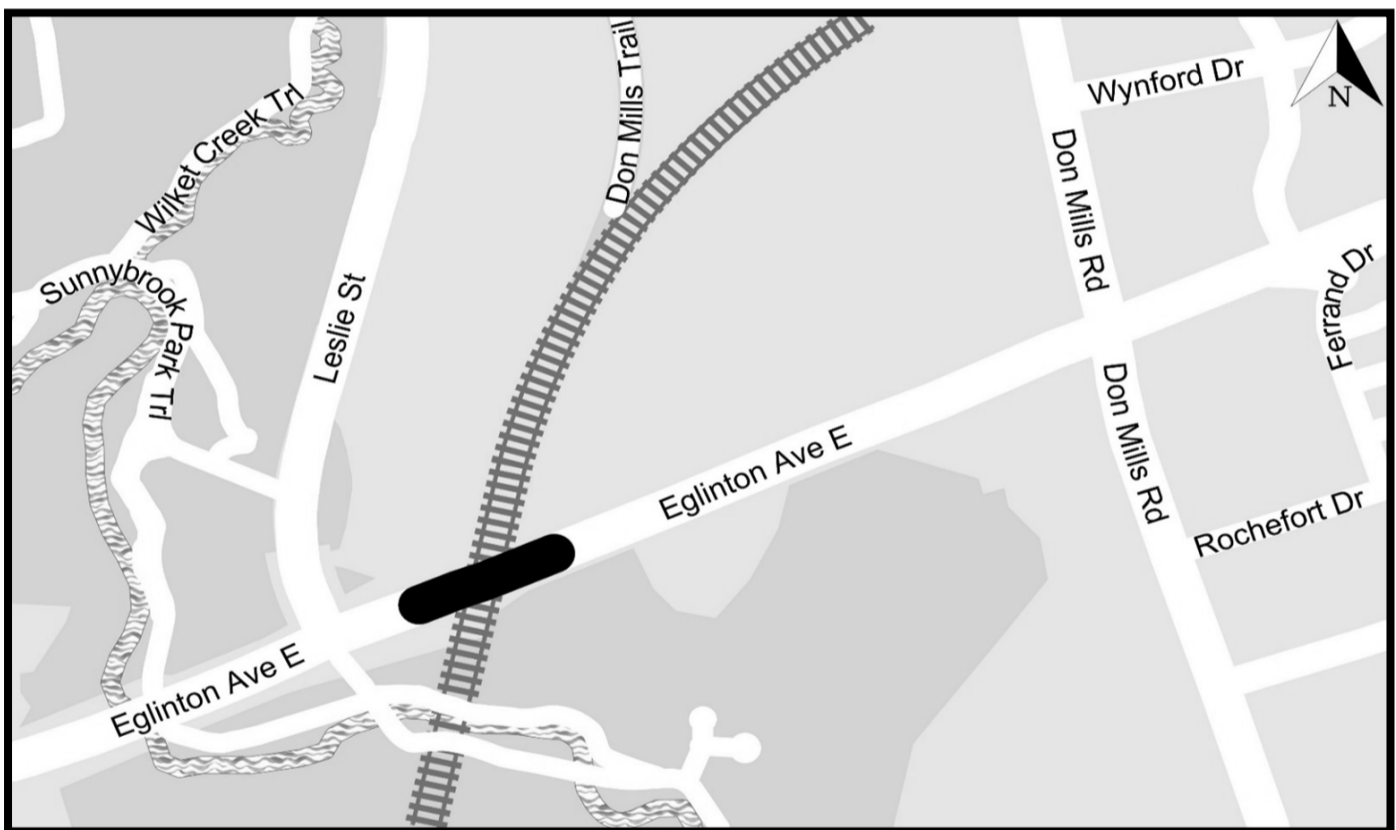

The City of Toronto is rehabilitating the CP Rail Bridge over Eglinton Avenue, east of Leslie Street. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. Work on this project is currently behind schedule. The delay was caused by unforeseen complications with bearing work.

This has now impacted snow clearing operations, which requires the Contractor to demobilize from site from December 2022 to March 2023. The contractor plans to resume work April 1st, 2023 (weather permitting). We know this project has an impact to businesses and residents along Eglinton Avenue. We sympathize and appreciate your patience with the dust, noise, fencing and other inconveniences.

WORK STATUS TO DATE

The City's contractor has completed the following work:

- Concrete patch repair ballast walls, retaining walls, wingwalls;
- Reface concrete abutment walls;
- Apply concrete sealer on exposed concrete including abutment walls, ballast walls, wingwalls, and retaining walls.

REMAINING WORK

The contractor will be completing the following work in the coming months:

- Structural steel repairs;
- Blast clean and coat exposed structural steel;
- Concrete patch repair soffit and fascia;
- Remove and reinstate sidewalk;
- Recondition bearings
