\*Equity-deserving groups include racialized people; newcomers; persons with disabilities; women; youth; persons with low income; and Two-Spirit, lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, queer+ communities. Examples of racialized people include East Asian, South Asian, Southeast Asian, West Asian, Indo-Caribbean, Arab, Middle Eastern, Latin American. Examples of newcomers include immigrants and refugees who have recently arrived in Toronto, refugee claimants, temporary residents, and undocumented persons.

Note: If you are proposing to rename a street in Toronto, you must demonstrate that 75% of residents surrounding the street support the proposed renaming. City Council may waive this requirement if the current street name meets criteria under Section 8.1 of the [Street Naming Policy](#).

If proposing to name an unnamed street in Toronto, you must demonstrate support for the proposal from 50% of residents, property owners, local community members and/or local organizations that surround the street.
