## Full Closure of Rosedale Valley Road, between Park Road and Bayview Avenue for Removal of Glen Road Pedestrian Bridge

Contract: 21ECS-TI-09BE

Project Start Date: March 2022 Project End Date: October 2023

*\*Timeline is subject to change.*

The City's contractor is now ready to remove the Glen Road Pedestrian Bridge (also known as the 'Morley Callaghan Footbridge') across the Rosedale Valley Ravine. The bridge also adjoins the pedestrian tunnel which runs under Bloor Street East to the Sherbourne Subway Station east entrance on the southern end of Glen Road. The tunnel will remain closed during the duration of the bridge removal and until it is replaced later this year.

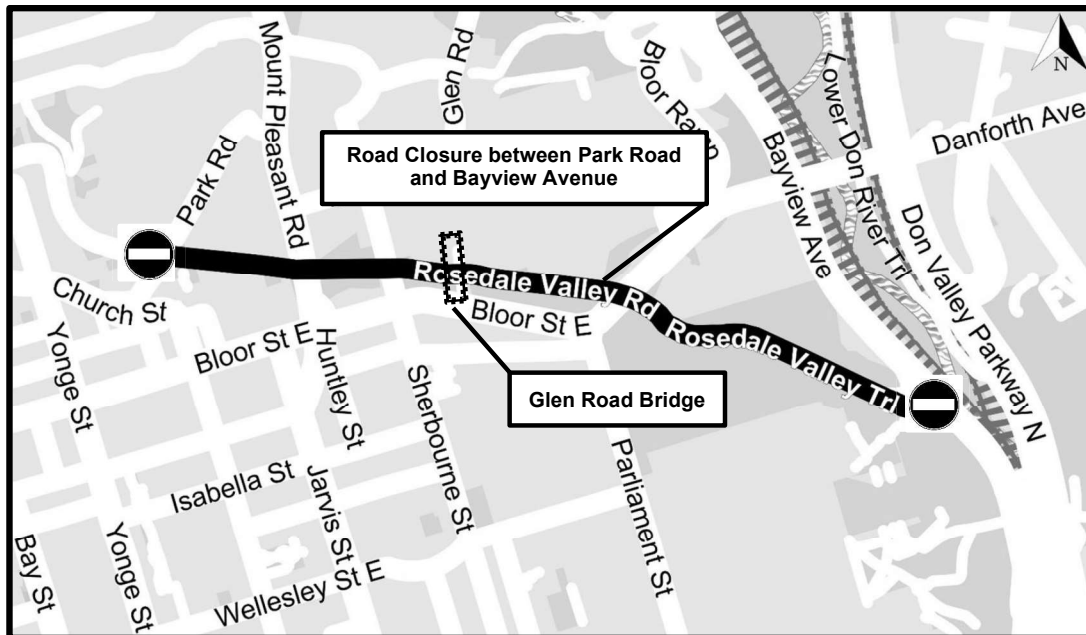
**To safely remove the Glen Road Pedestrian Bridge structure that spans over Rosedale Valley Road, there will be a full closure of Rosedale Valley Road from Park Road to Bayview Avenue, starting at 12 a.m. on Saturday, February 4 until 6 a.m. on Monday, February 6, 2023.**

Depending on weather conditions, additional time may be necessary to complete this work. Updates on the contractor's progress will be posted on the project webpage at [toronto.ca/glen-rd-ped-bridge](https://toronto.ca/glen-rd-ped-bridge).

Ahead of the bridge removal work, there will be no access to the multi-use trail on the same section of Rosedale Valley Road from **Friday, January 13 to Friday, January 27, 2023** to allow work crews to set up and remove the required equipment. Access to the multi-use trail will temporarily re-open from **Saturday, January 28 to Friday, February 3.**




Two additional road closures of Rosedale Valley Road will be required next year to install the new bridge structure. A notice will be sent in advance of each closure.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	<p><b>Overnight Work Hours:</b> Work will take place 24-hours a day for the entire weekend. The use of extended work hours is aimed at minimizing the overall disruption this work will have on area residents and access to Rosedale Valley Road.</p> <p>Please note that the overnight work will involve loud noise, vibration, and dust as crews operate heavy equipment to remove the old bridge structure and beeping from trucks backing-up.</p> <p><b>Please be advised that this work is exempt from the City’s Noise Bylaw. The work area will be well lit and loud. Staff will be monitoring the vibration caused by the demolition.</b></p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Rosedale Valley Road will close to through traffic starting at <b>12 a.m. on February 4 until 6 a.m. on February 6.</b></p> <p>Signage will be installed in advance at key locations to alert commuters about this weekend road closure. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p>
	<p><b>Pedestrians and Cyclists:</b> For safety reasons, pedestrians and cyclists will not be able to access the multi-use trail on Rosedale Valley Road between Park Road and Bayview Avenue. <b>This will take place from January 13 to January 27 and during the road closure.</b> This to allow work crews to safely set up and then remove the equipment that will be used to remove the old bridge.</p> <p>Depending on weather conditions this closure may be extended. Updated information will be posted on the project webpage listed below.</p>
