Watermain Replacement on Disan Court


Contract: 22ECS-LU-02SU Start Date: September 19, 2022 Winter Shutdown Begins: December 23, 2022 Permanent Restoration: Spring 2023 End Date: September 2023 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto's project to replace the watermain and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Disan Court is almost complete. Due to ground and weather conditions, the contractor will be shutting down the site for the winter. Work this year wrapped up on December 23, and will resume in the spring of 2023.

Prior to leaving the site, the contractor permanently restored driveways, and temporarily restored sidewalks/curbs and the roadway with temporary asphalt, and temporarily restored lawn areas with soil. Once weather conditions are favourable, the contractor will return in the spring of 2023 to permanently complete the sidewalk/curb, sod, and roadway. A construction update notice will be issued before work restarts.

• In the spring of 2023, the contractor will permanently restore areas affected by watermain and water service installation.
