Recent Increase in Drug-Related Deaths in Toronto

Why are we sending this alert?

- Over the last few days, there has been an **increase in the number of fatal suspected opioid overdose calls** attended by Toronto Paramedics Services.
- Preliminary data shows that from January 19-22, 2023 there were 9 suspected opioid overdose-related deaths, including:
 - 3 deaths on Saturday, January 21st, 2023
 - 4 deaths on Sunday, January 22nd, 2023

Additional Information

- <u>Toronto's Drug Checking Service</u> continues to find highly potent opioids and benzodiazepinerelated drugs in samples expected to be fentanyl.
- While specific details are not known, there appears to be a range of drugs involved in this increase in overdose fatalities.

Note

- Toronto Public Health monitors non-fatal and fatal overdose calls. The increase in the number of fatal suspected opioid overdose calls triggered alert thresholds.
- Overdoses are occurring in a variety of neighbourhoods across the city.

Messages for people using drugs in Toronto:

- **Try not to use alone.** Buddy up with someone who you trust. Have a drug use safety plan and keep naloxone on-hand.
- Use a supervised consumption service, if possible. For locations and hours of sites please visit: toronto.ca/ConsumptionServices.
- If you must use alone, have a safety plan.
 - Get someone to check on you either by phone or in person.
 - Call the National Overdose Response Service at 1-888-688-NORS (6677) to get support while using alone.
 - Connect to community members virtually via the Brave app.
- Vet your supply. Ask others about what they are experiencing with the same drug or batch.
- Check what's in your drugs at local drug checking services. Your drugs might have unexpected substances in them. Have them checked at one of the drug checking service locations in <u>Toronto</u>.
- **Get naloxone**. Kits are available at Toronto Public Health, The Works, and through many <u>partner</u> <u>organizations</u>. Free naloxone kits are also available at some pharmacies. Visit <u>www.ontario.ca/page/get-naloxone-kits-free</u> or call 1-800-565-8603
