
Road Resurfacing on Middlefield Road from Steeles Avenue East to Passmore Avenue / Ingleton Boulevard & New Sidewalk Construction on West Side of Middlefield Road

Contract: 23ECS-RD-03MR
Start Date: August 14, 2023, End Date: November 24, 2023

The City of Toronto is planning to resurface Middlefield Road from 50m south of Steeles Avenue East to 50m north of Ingleton Avenue / Passmore Avenue. Our inspection of the Middlefield Road shows that it needs resurfacing, sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

In addition, the City is constructing a new sidewalk on the west side of Middlefield Road to improve safety for pedestrians. Sidewalks are a critical piece of transportation infrastructure that improve accessibility and safety for all road users, particularly for children, seniors and those with mobility challenges. This project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and new sidewalk for current and future needs.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible.
