Littleleaf Pedestrian Bridge Replacement & Mammoth Hall Trail Culvert Rehabilitation

Contract: 22ECS-BE-05BSE Start Date: July 4, 2023 End Date: March 31, 2024 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is planning to replace the Littleleaf Pedestrian Bridge and rehabilitate Mammoth Hall Trial culvert. This work will ensure that the bridge structures meet today's standards and remain safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. Access to the pedestrian bridge and the trail leading to the bridge will be restricted for the duration of the work. The project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Littleleaf Pedestrian Bridge
 - Construct temporary cofferdams, excavation and dewatering;
 - Remove existing pedestrian bridge;
 - Construct reinforced concrete foundations and substructure for pedestrian bridge;
 - Fabricate (design by Contractor) and install new metal pedestrian bridge;
 - Construct reinforced concrete deck slab;
 - Construct pedestrian/bicycle railing;
 - Construct approach slabs and expansion joints;
 - Install rock protection at the abutments;
 - Asphalt paving for multi-use pathways;

Mammoth Hall Trail Culvert

- Patch repairs and crack sealing throughout the existing concrete box culvert;
- Partial depth concrete removal for spall and delamination areas;
- Abrasive blast cleaning of the reinforcing steel;
- Partial removal and replacement of chain-link fence in order to accommodate the work;
- Medium to wide cracks will be repaired by crack injection;
- Joints between the precast units will be repaired;
- All built-up debris throughout the culvert will be removed;
- Bank protection work will be completed along the southwestern bank at the downstream limit of the wingwall to address local erosion issues.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

• You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, Saturday, 9 a.m. to 7. p.m. Sunday, approval required. No work on, Civic/Statutory Holidays.
÷	Trail Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, access to the trails will be restricted within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing and will follow relevant COVID protocols. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector and follow public health directions for reducing the spread of COVID-19 during in-person communication.
Ġ	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
