## Road Resurfacing on Glen Echo Road from Yonge Street to Bocastle Avenue

### Contract: 22ECS-TI-13LR


On March 9, 2023 the City of Toronto issued a notice of road resurfacing work taking place in Don Valley West this year. The approximate project schedule is:

#### Start Date: May 15, 2023, End Date: July 7, 2023

These dates represent the earliest start date in the area. If more than one street in your area is being resurfaced, as shown on the map below, then the exact start date on your street may vary. The timeline for construction is subject to change.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.
