The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary sewer system in your area in order to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the sanitary sewer construction work on Westgate Boulevard, the road will be closed at the end of the Westgate Boulevard cul-de-sac to Westgate Crescent effective from 7:00 a.m. on Monday July 3rd, 2023, to 7:00 p.m. on Friday July 28th, 2023.

Motorists are reminded to abide by traffic/construction signs posted in local areas to ensure the safe travel of all local road users, pedestrians, and cyclists. This project is part of the Council approved 2023 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system; renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

	<p>Traffic Management:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The cul-de-sac of Westgate Boulevard will be fully closed during the duration of the work. Access for Westgate Crescent will be maintained. • If your driveway access is impacted, you will receive a notice 48 hours in advance. • There will be detour signs in the area to provide motorists with alternate routes.
	<p>Pedestrians: There are no existing sidewalks; However, safe pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday.</p>
