








Mid-rise buildings are bigger than houses but smaller than towers. Mid-rise buildings have a good scale and relationship to the street. They define or make walls to the street that are tall enough to feel like a city and provide lots of usable space, but low enough to let the sun in and open the view to the sky from the street. They support a comfortable pedestrian environment, and animate the street by lining the sidewalk with doors and windows with active uses including stores, restaurants, services, grade related apartments, and community uses.









Tall buildings are generally defined as buildings with height that is greater than the width of the adjacent street right-of-way or the wider of two streets if located at an intersection. Most Tall buildings in Toronto will follow a classic form and consist of three carefully integrated parts: a base building, middle, and top, each with a particular role to play in achieving the goals of the Official Plan.




