








## **Existing Site Lighting**

## **Project Scope and Limiting Factors**

#### **Project Scope:**

- What is possible? (Core park design elements, pathways, landform, planting, site furnishings, enhanced materials, fitness and play, public art, Indigenous place-keeping, etc.)
- What isn't possible? (Buildings incl. bathrooms / pavilions, pool, skating rink, encroachment into the rail corridor, etc.)
- What are the limiting factors? (Metrolinx work, soil contamination / soil cap, grading constraints, rail corridor, budget).

## Connectivity

(within each park, between the parks and to the broader community / city)

- Increase connectivity
- Accessible to all
- Pathways and trails
- Multi-use trail considerations
- Spatial connection between two park spaces
- How Park spaces relate to each other
- Connections to and from the parks
- Lighting (and safety)
- Specific noted connection suggestions:
  - Path from Garrison Crossing to existing stairs at Wellington Street W. (east side of park)



## Programming

(quiet and active spaces / uses)

- Create a sense of community (incl. gathering spaces, social spaces)
- Promote physical activity incl. courts and fitness equipment (incl. pickleball, tennis, skating, volleyball)
- Promote healthy living
- Dogs (on leash)
- Playground (incl. space for families with children)
- Picnic area
- Benches and seating
- Spaces with water play



# **Ecology** (plants, trees, and greenery)

- Naturalization
- Carolinian forest savannah with wildflowers and oak trees
- Native species
- Trees (incl. mature trees and fruit trees) and tree canopy for shade
- Pollinator gardens
- Gardens (incl. rain gardens like Toronto Music Garden)
- Expand current community garden
- Clean grass
- Meadows (uncut grass) to attract pollinators such as birds and bees
- Diverse fauna and flora shrubs and flowers and creating habitat for wildlife)
- Maintenance



## Unique Features

(Things to define this place, what makes them special)

- Natural Heritage
- Cultural heritage
- Indigenous place-keeping
- Unique character
- Gardens with sculptures from local sculptors
- City views (incl. the trains, the moon, stars, sunset/sunrise and city skyline)
