### Road Resurfacing on Alberta Avenue from Davenport Road to Burlington Crescent and on Regal Road from Mount Royal Avenue to Glenholme Avenue

#### Contract: 22ECS-TI-03LR Start Date: April 24, 2023, End Date: October 13, 2023 \*Timeline is subject to change.

This notice provides an update on the status of the construction for the road resurfacing work on Alberta Avenue from Davenport Road to Burlington Crescent and Regal Road from Mount Royal Avenue to Glenholme Avenue. To date work is on schedule, roadway asphalt removal will start on Monday July 24, and is anticipated to take 2-3 days to complete. New asphalt will be installed throughout the week of July 31, weather dependent.

Low amounts of asbestos have been detected in the asphalt roadway which will be removed and disposed by our contractor as per City protocols. See asbestos information in table below. Residents should expect minimal delays when traveling through area. We appreciate your patience with the dust, noise, fencing and other inconveniences.

#### WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews are replacing concrete sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement.
- Asphalt removal work will follow on the week of July 24, 2023
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Update Notice before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

Ŀ	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the <b>Project Manager</b> listed below.

	<b>Parking:</b> This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location		
	<b>Parking Violation Notices:</b> <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at</u> <u>all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:		
	<ol> <li>Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) <u>or</u></li> <li>File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction.</li> </ol>		
	If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.		
	<b>Please note:</b> Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegative parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).		
	In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patie with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may new temporarily park on your street.		
$\mathbf{\hat{N}}$	<b>Asbestos in Asphalt:</b> As part of the work, the City tested asphalt samples from Alberta Avenue and Regal Road and found traces of asbestos in one small area on each street. As per the City contract our contractor will be safely removing and disposing of all asphalt that contains any asbestos from both streets.		
	Asbestos was used in asphalt mixes throughout the 1970s and early 1980s to improve the performance of the asphalt. Air quality monitoring conducted by the City of Toronto at other sites has not detected asbestos fibres in the air as a result of resurfacing asphalt. The risk of exposure to asbestos for workers and bystanders is low.		
	<ul> <li>As a precaution, the City requires the contractor to follow these steps:</li> <li>Wet the pavement during asphalt cutting, grinding or removal</li> <li>Attach dust collecting devices with HEPA filters to equipment, where possible, to prevent dust from becoming airborne</li> <li>Provide personal protective equipment (disposable coveralls and respirators) to on-site workers</li> <li>Transport and dispose of asphalt containing asbestos to provincially</li> </ul>		
	approved disposal sites
