Storm Sewer Investigations in the Easement South of George Anderson Drive, East of Culford Road

Expected Start Date: Mid-August, 2023

Expected End Date: December 31, 2023

The City of Toronto is working on a project to assess the storm sewer condition along the easement south of George Anderson Drive, East of Culford Road, starting in August. As part of this project, various investigations will be conducted to inform the need for City work that could help improve performance of the stormwater management system. Please refer to the Work Details table below for further information about the planned investigations.

WORK DETAILS

Investigation	Anticipated	Description
CCTV Catchbasin Inspection	3-4 days	<p>Catchbasins are the structures that collect rainwater and runoff at the surface and through their grated lid, and convey the water to the storm sewer.</p> <p>Toronto Water will clean the catchbasins and their sewer connections, and use CCTV cameras to inspect their condition.</p>
Site Survey	1 week	<p>THAM Survey, a subconsultant retained by the City to do this investigation, will use survey equipment to record the elevation of the ground, and the locations of key above-ground features in the easement, such as trees and fence lines.</p> <p>This information informs the creation of any engineering drawings needed for the City's work.</p>
Geotechnical Investigation	2 weeks	<p>Englobe, a subconsultant retained by the City to do this investigation, will use equipment to take deep soil samples from the ground.</p> <p>This information informs the engineering design of any underground work required.</p>
Arborist Inventory	1-2 days	<p>LGL, a subconsultant retained by the City to do this investigation, will visually inspect and record information</p>

		<p>about the trees present on the site, including their species, size, and health.</p> <p>This information informs future assessments of how any work might impact the trees, and mitigation measures required to protect them.</p>
Future Work	TBD	These investigations and further engineering review will help determine next steps required to rehabilitate the sewer and keep it in a good state of repair.
