Basement Flooding Protection Program Infrastructure Upgrades on Jane Street, Wilson Avenue and Other Local Roads



The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary sewer system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. This work also involves replacing the City-owned portion of substandard water services and sanitary sewer laterals. This notice provides an update on the status of work to date. This project is part of the Council-approved 2020 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.



Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.

- Traffic on streets where the work is taking place will be reduced to one lane.
- Road Closure is anticipated at the intersection of Jane Street and William Cragg, a road detour will be provided.



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.



Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions, however any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.



Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.



Parking Violation Notices: Please ensure that you park in a legal parking spot at all times. If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date:

- 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the yellow ticket)
- 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City, online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the yellow ticket). As part of the dispute



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	process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. Please note: Parking violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (e.g., in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).
Ė	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
