
Basement Flooding Study Area 53

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Notice of Study Completion

The City of Toronto has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study that examines surface and basement flooding within Study Area 53 and identifies improvements that can be made to city infrastructure to reduce the risk of future flooding. The Study Area 53 EA is bound by Marine Parade Drive, the CN rail line, Burlington Street and Lake Ontario, and has experienced basement and surface flooding during severe rainstorms in the past.



Following consultation with technical agencies and the public, the City is recommending:

- a new 1500 mm storm sewer along Lake Shore Boulevard West, south of TTC streetcar track from Fleeceline Road to existing Mimico Creek storm sewer outfall
- four high capacity catch basins on Lake Shore Boulevard West along the new storm sewer and at Greystone Court
- upsizing the local storm sewer on Legion Road to 450 mm and 750 mm pipes, with inlet control devices upstream
- upsizing the existing Mimico Creek storm water outfall to 1500 mm at Humber Bay Park.

The study has been planned following the Schedule B process in the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment.
