
WASTE COLLECTION SCHEDULE 2024

Please keep this annual schedule for your reference throughout the year.

HOUSEHOLD COLLECTION TUESDAY DAY 2



CURBSIDE COLLECTION

Your Green Bin, Blue Bin, Garbage Bin, yard waste and oversized items must be set out no earlier than 8 p.m. the night before and no later than 7 a.m. on your scheduled collection day. The lid opening must face the street and the bins must be set out squarely facing the street.



To order, exchange or request a repair for a Blue Bin, Garbage Bin or Green Bin, visit: toronto.ca/311 or call 311. Fees apply when upsizing your garbage bin.

GREEN BIN ORGANICS

- Do NOT put items in loose.
- You must line your kitchen catcher or outdoor Green Bin. Do not line both.
- Use a plastic or paper bag for either container. Compostable bags are not necessary.
- The handle of the bin must be set in the locked position.

Put any excess recycling in a clear

plastic bag beside your Blue Bin. Bags

cannot be larger than your Blue Bin.

cardboard and place in your Blue Bin. Excess cardboard should be flattened

and bundled to a size that would fit in

the Blue Bin and placed beside the bin.

BLUE BIN RECYCLING

- Put items in LOOSE and not bagged (except for shredded paper and paper less than 2 inches on any side).
- Do NOT line your Blue Bin with a plastic bag.
- All recycling should fit in your Blue Bin with the lid closed.
- Ties/bungee cords must be completely removed before collection.

GARBAGE BIN

- Garbage must fit in your Garbage Bin with the lid closed.
- Ties/bungee cords must be completely removed before collection.

EXCESS GARBAGE

- Must be put in a regular garbage bag.
- Must have a Garbage Tag.
- Garbage Tags can be purchased at toronto.ca/solidwastestore or Toronto Canadian Tire and Shoppers
- Drug Mart stores. Tags never expire. • Bags cannot weigh more than 20 kg (44 lb).

REDUCE YOUR WASTE AND DOWNSIZE YOUR BIN TO SAVE MONEY To change your bin size, contact 311



YARD WASTE

- Use a paper yard waste bag or rigid open-topped container (external height no less than 55 cm and no greater than 95 cm).
- Yard waste in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected.
- Grass clippings, sod and soil will not be collected. Remove excess soil from pulled weeds.
- Secure brush and branches in bundles no longer than 1.2 m (4 ft), no wider than 0.6 m (2 ft) and no heavier than 20 kg (44 lb).
- Diameter of the branches cannot exceed 7.5 cm (3 in). For branches that exceed this size, make arrangements with a private company for collection. Visit toronto.ca/yardwaste for more

ELECTRONIC WASTE

Electronic waste (e.g., keyboards, computer cables, televisions) can be left next to your Garbage Bin for pickup on garbage day. Small electronic items should be put out in a clear plastic bag or cardboard box.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED AT CURBSIDE OR DROP-OFF DEPOTS (\mathbf{X})

Dead animals, rocks, sand, gravel, bricks, concrete, cinder blocks, paving stones, asphalt, ammunition, asbestos, etc. Contact a private company to arrange for proper disposal of these items.

OVERSIZED ITEMS

Items that will not fit in your Garbage Bin, even when empty, are considered oversized.

Oversized items can be left 0.5 m (2 ft) away from your Garbage Bin on Garbage day for regular collection. No Garbage Tags or appointment required.



Furniture

Box springs, dressers, chairs, mattresses, patio furniture, etc.

Sofa beds




It is not necessary to separate the metal frame from the sofa. For safety reasons, the frame must be tied to prevent it from springing open.



Wall Units

Separate into lengths no greater than 2.5 m (8 ft).

Metal



Carpeting, underpad and linoleum

Items must be tied in rolls no longer than 1.2 m (4 ft) and weighing less than 20 kg (44 lb).

Toilets

If the tank is removable, it must be separated from the bowl.

Other



Luggage, skis, lamps, baby strollers, baby car seats, etc.

HOUSEHOLD **HAZARDOUS WASTE**

Items such as batteries, cooking oil, medications, bleach, propane tanks and cylinders, syringes/ needles, paint and fuel are considered household hazardous waste and will not be collected at the curb.
