TTC Streetcar Track Replacement and Watermain Replacement at Dufferin Street and Springhurst Avenue/ Fort Rouille Street

Contract: 23ECS-RD-11SP

Start Date: Early September 2023 End Date: December 31 2023

**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto and Toronto Transit Commission plan to replace aging streetcar tracks on Springhurst Avenue from Dufferin Street to Fort Rouille Street, including the Dufferin Street loop. The City will also replace the watermain and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Fort Rouille Street and on Springhurst Avenue from east of Dufferin Street to Fort Rouille Street.

The water service is the underground pipe that brings water to your water meter and is owned by you and by the City. The part you own is from your house to the end of your property, the part the City owns is from the end of your property to the watermain.

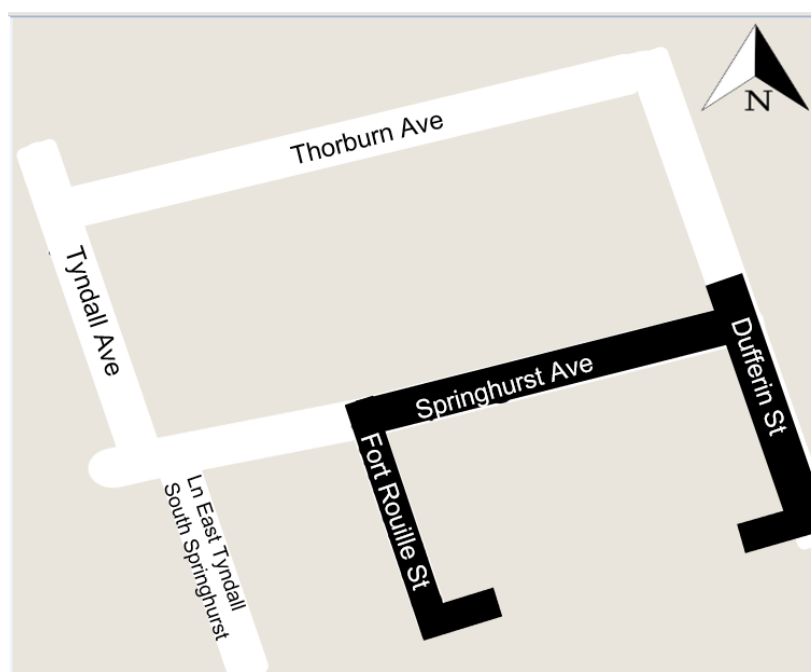
This project will be coordinated with the emergency repairs of the Dufferin Street Bridge.

This work is required to bring the aging infrastructure to a state of good repair and is part of the Council-approved 2023 Capital Works Program.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD WATER SERVICES

If you live on Springhurst Avenue and Fort Rouille Street in a house that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Please read the attached fact sheet with important information about the risks of lead in drinking water, especially if someone in your house is pregnant, there are children under six years old, or there is an infant drinking formula made using tap water.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property



	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place 24 hours 7 days a week. Excavation activities and heavy breaking will be carried out at various times throughout the day. All concrete breaking activities will occur between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. Concrete breaking work is the most disruptive and will typically last the first 1-2 days for each phase of the construction. Around-the-clock work during rail installation by TTC is required to preserve the integrity and quality of new rail and concrete. Overnight rail work by TTC may consist of moving new rail into position, rail installation and rail welding / grinding.</p>
	<p>Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please read the attached fact sheet as it contains important information about lead in drinking water and water service replacement. First, find out if your water service is lead – a licensed plumber can help you with this. If it is lead, the City of Toronto encourages you to replace it. We recommend you obtain several quotes. Please note: The City is not able to get involved in any contract to have work done on private property. Property owners are responsible for ensuring contractors do not interfere with the work being done on City property. Learn more at toronto.ca/leadpipes</p>
	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems, heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Public Consultation contact listed below.</p>
	<p>During construction, the following services will be temporarily modified:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 504 King streetcar (B branch only) • 29 Dufferin Bus • 329 Dufferin Night Bus • 929 Dufferin Express Bus <p>Bus routes will only be impacted as of October 8th, 2023, once Phase 2 of construction begins.</p> <p>Additional information will be provided before construction starts. Visit ttc.ca/serviceadvisories for the most up to date information on service changes.</p>
	<p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, please contact us at the information listed below.</p>
