## Road Resurfacing on Jane Street from Dundas Street West to Annette Street

#### Contract: 22ECS-TI-13MR Start Date: July 2022 End Date: October 2022 \*Timeline is subject to change.


The City of Toronto is planning to resurface Jane Street from Dundas Street West to Annette Street. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaying and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2022 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

#### WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible.
