Bathurst Manor Neighbourhood Mobility Plan

In consultation with the local community, the City is developing a Neighbourhood Mobility Plan (NMP) for the Bathurst Manor area that identifies, prioritizes and recommends short, medium, and long-term improvements to traffic operations and road design to support safety for all modes of transportation.

The NMP will help to address three main areas of concern raised by the community, which have been evaluated and verified through recent traffic studies:

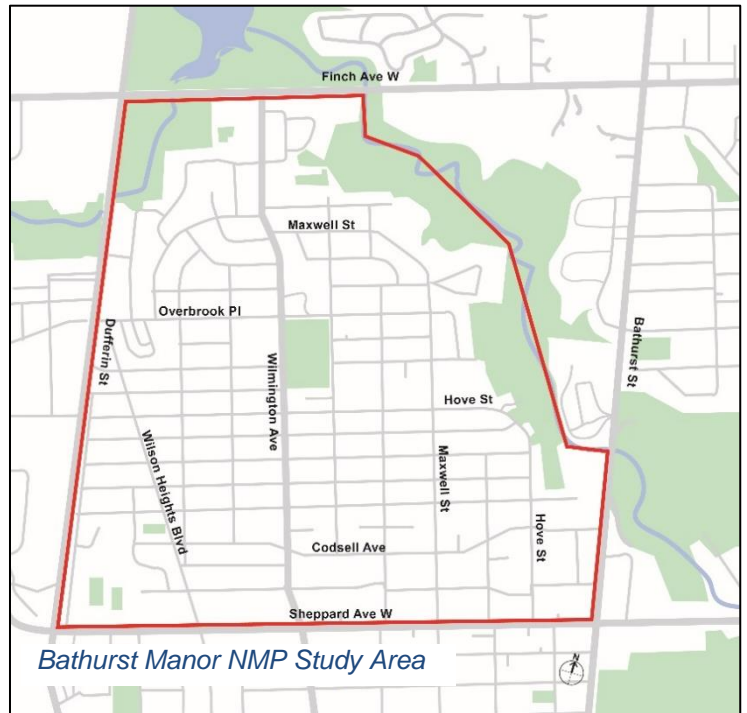
1. Road safety for vulnerable road users (e.g. seniors, school children, pedestrians and people cycling)
2. Excessive speeding
3. Cut-through traffic using neighbourhood streets as a by-pass route

Residents and businesses are invited to learn more about the proposed plan for Bathurst Manor and provide feedback before October 11, 2023.

Proposed Changes

The NMP proposes specific short-to-medium term changes to improve safety and mobility in the Bathurst Manor neighbourhood:

- One-way routing on sections of Codsell Avenue, Cocksfield Avenue, Hove Street and Kennard Avenue
- Speed humps on sections of Cedar Springs Grove, Cocksfield Avenue, Codsell Avenue, Hove Street, Maxwell Street, Purdon Drive and Overbrook Place
- In-road flex posts on Wilmington Avenue
- All-way stop signs on Elder Street and Tillplain Road
- Traffic signal at the intersection of Codsell Avenue and Wilmington Avenue
- A pedestrian crosswalk at the intersection of Codsell Avenue and Wilson Heights Boulevard



Additionally, the plan identifies longer-term priorities for new sidewalks to be delivered with road reconstruction, as well as additional bikeways.

The participation of local residents and stakeholders is essential to identifying appropriate actions and changes for the neighbourhood. **In response to community interest, a brief presentation and opportunity for Q&A will be included in the public drop-in event where residents and stakeholders can learn more about the proposed changes and the community feedback survey.**

What is a Neighbourhood Mobility Plan (NMP)?

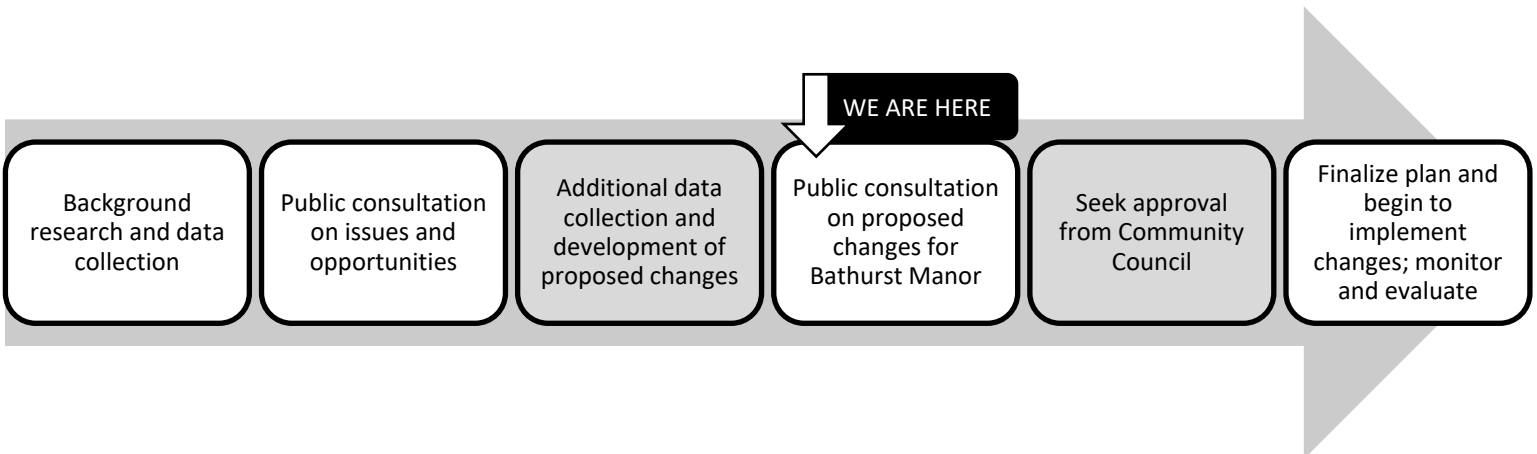
In 2019, North York Community Council directed City staff to work with the community to develop a comprehensive plan to address community concerns about mobility and safety for road users in Bathurst Manor. City staff have used a holistic approach to assess and manage traffic issues within the neighbourhood. The Bathurst Manor NMP considers all modes of transportation, with an emphasis on improving conditions for vulnerable road users such as seniors, students, pedestrians, and people cycling. The final NMP will recommend actions related to motor vehicle speed and volume management, and traffic safety conflicts on local streets. NMP recommendations are informed by the City’s Traffic Calming Guide, Vision Zero Action Plan, and Complete Streets Guidelines.




In 2023, the City launched Neighbourhood Streets Plans to make it fair and transparent for neighbourhoods to access City-led, community-guided plans for traffic, road safety, and active transportation. The Bathurst Manor NMP is considered an early entrant and model for this new program.
