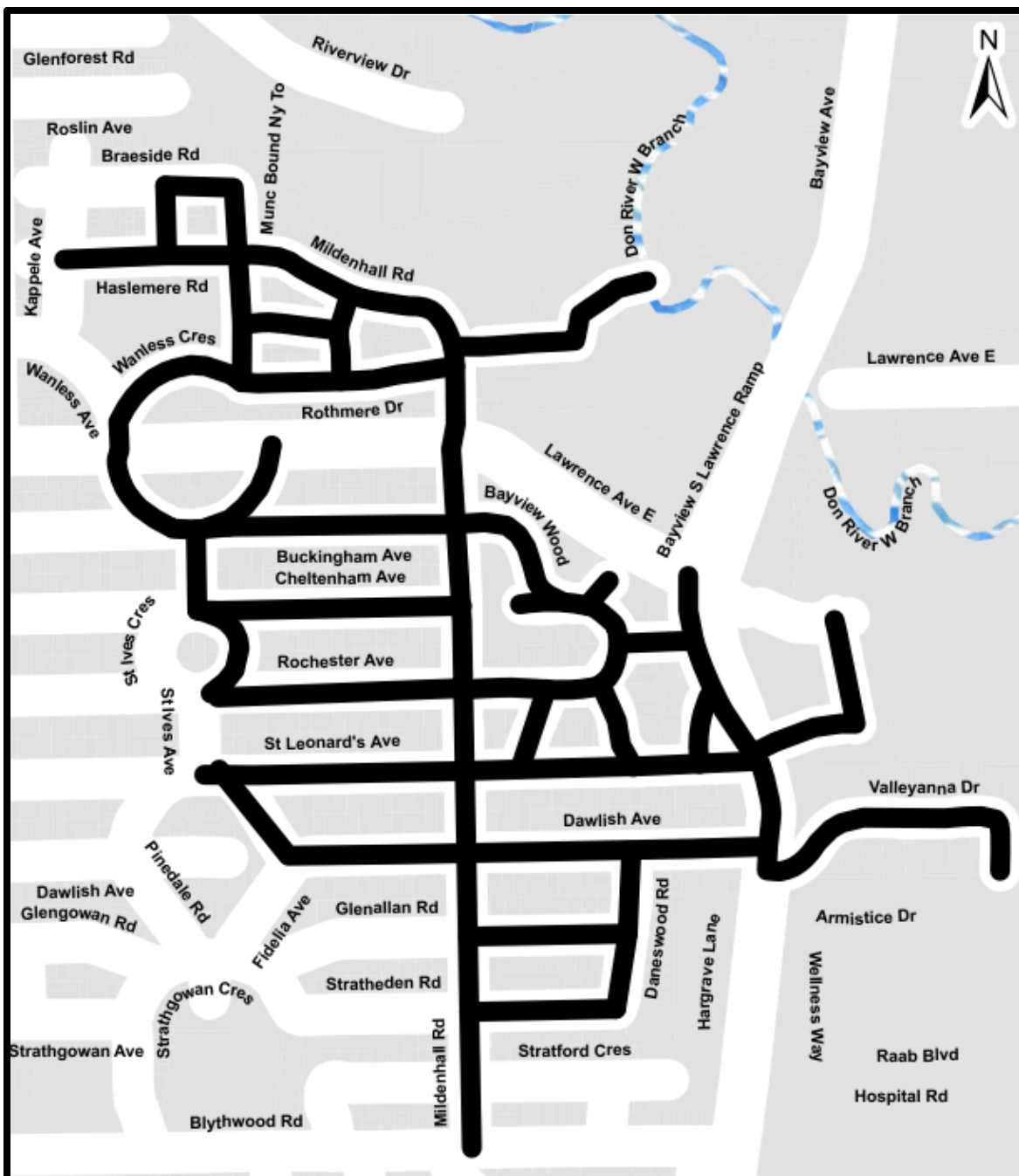
Basement Flooding Protection Program Lawrence Park Neighbourhood Road Reconstruction and Basement Flooding Improvements Preliminary Design Field Investigations

Expected Start Date: Fall 2023 Expected End Date: Spring 2024
*Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto completed the Lawrence Park Neighbourhood Investigation of Basement Flooding (Area 20) and Road Improvement Class Environmental Assessment and developed a Master Plan in 2017 to address road conditions and to reduce the risk of basement flooding. The Environment Assessment identified a number of road and infrastructure improvements including road reconstruction, road resurfacing, new sidewalks as well as sewer upgrades.

Starting this fall, the City will carry out field investigations to inform future design work for the first phase of these improvements. The map on the following page shows the streets where investigation work is planned. More information about the design process and opportunities for public feedback will be provided through future notices. Construction for the first phase of improvements is not anticipated to begin until 2026.

SITE INVESTIGATION WORK DETAILS

Site work crews will

- Photograph site conditions
- Conduct topographical surveys within roadways and boulevards to record the location and elevation of key surface features.
- Assess the condition of trees within or close to the site and record the location and species.
- Gather soil samples from within the roadway and boulevard by drilling boreholes for geotechnical investigations. If necessary, a temporary piezometer (small pipe) will be installed within boreholes to allow for ongoing groundwater measurements. Any necessary piezometer will be protected with a cover, fencing, or other means suitable for the piezometer's location until it is removed.
- Conduct a subsurface utility engineering (SUE) survey to locate and record underground utility locations. Utilities will be marked with temporary paint and removable flags.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING SITE WORK

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Site visits will typically occur Monday to Friday between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Unloading and loading equipment may result in temporary disruption to local traffic. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and vehicle traffic restrictions will be necessary.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The sampling areas will be restored when work is complete.</p>
