Contract: 23ECS-RD-15LR

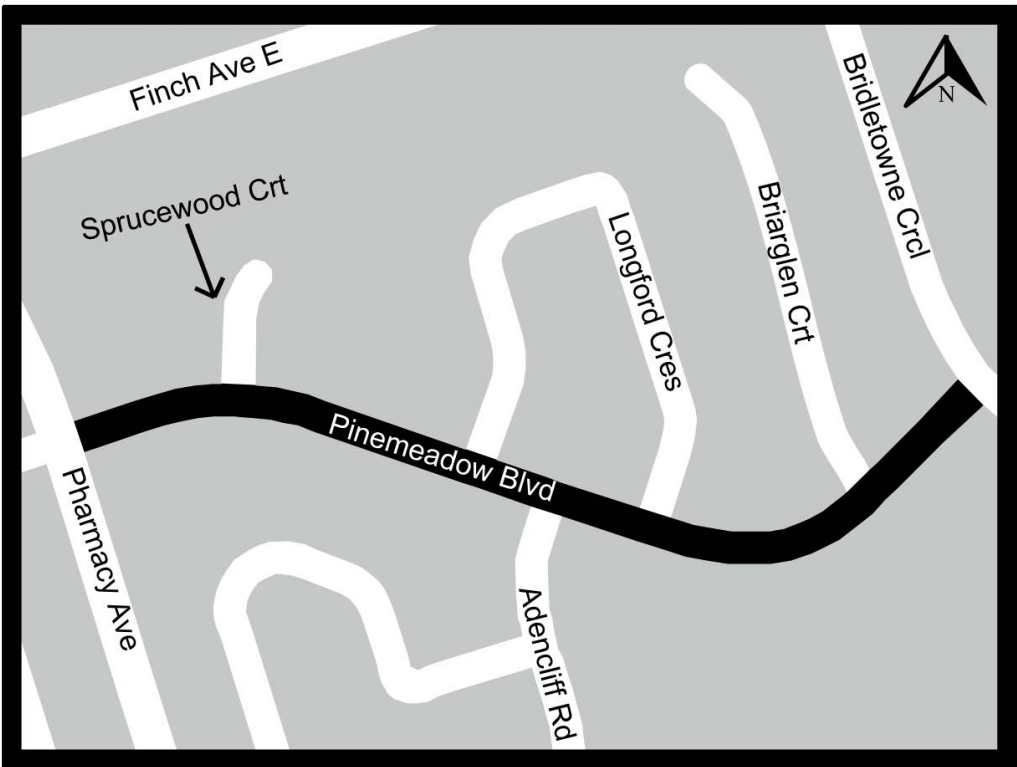
On May 1 2023 the City of Toronto issued a notice of road resurfacing work taking place in Scarborough-Agincourt this year. The approximate project schedule is:

Start Date: August 28, 2023, End Date: October 20, 2023

The timeline for construction is subject to change.




This project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.

	<p>Parking Violation Notice: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non payment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Pay the ticket violation (follow the instructions on the back of the notice) or2. File a parking violation dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person— (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. <p>If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice please call 311 to request a copy.</p> <p>Please note: Violation notices cannot be canceled vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbors who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.</p>
	<p>Telephone and Internet Services: This work may affect phone and internet cables for individual properties that aren't buried deep below the sidewalk. The contractor will coordinate with utility companies to minimize disruption. Residents who find their service has been disrupted should contact the Field Ambassador and notify their phone or internet service provider.</p>
	<p>Asbestos in Asphalt on Pinemeadow Boulevard: As part of the work, the City must test the removed asphalt for asbestos. Initial tests for asbestos in the asphalt on Pinemeadow Boulevard were inconclusive. Further review of available information found that the asphalt on Pinemeadow Boulevard does not contain Asbestos.</p> <p>Asbestos was used in asphalt mixes throughout the 1970s and early 1980s to improve the performance of the asphalt. Air quality monitoring conducted by the City of Toronto at other sites has not detected asbestos fibres in the air as a result of resurfacing asphalt. The risk of exposure to asbestos for workers and bystanders is low.</p> <p>As a precaution, the City requires the contractor to follow these steps:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Wet the pavement during asphalt cutting, grinding or removal,• Attach dust collecting devices with HEPA filters to equipment, where possible, to prevent dust from becoming airborne,• Provide personal protective equipment (disposable coveralls and respirators) to on-site workers, and• Transport and dispose of asphalt containing asbestos to provincially approved disposal sites.
